The Mad Butcher Twilight Series has come to a close and once again we must thank Wayne Gerrand from the Palmerston North Shop for his continued support. All the preliminary work with Wallace Development is moving past us with the 12th realignment work ready to kick start on April 1 or thereabouts. Plans are on display in the card room to view and we now wait for this work to be completed. As previously stated That Lawn Company will be doing the construction work. It is our intention to send emails out regarding any work that will possibly affect the playing of the existing hole. There are a couple of large trees that need to be felled and trimming of others, health & safety will be paramount while this work is done. Work is also commencing with the replanting of the 12th boundary and in behind the 14th green. Total Landscape Supplies along with WDCL and the Golf Club have had discussions on the landscaping and how the boundary will look in years to come. Once we have more detail and illustrations to show, we will put these on display.

The development has been well supported by potential purchasers with eleven sections under contract.

We have had further meetings with PNCC on the possible sale of the river land with very little to report since last month. The Council are working with surveyors to provide the exact size of the title boundaries and once this is confirmed our negotiations will continue and plan which is the best way forward.

On Monday 1 April we change the software the administration team use on a daily basis. Hopefully we won't experience any bumps on the way but if we do, we ask that you please cut us some slack while we get the transition up and running and fully operational.

Subscription invoicing will look new and as we roll out different parts of software. We will keep you informed.

Club Captain's Report



The players with the four best nett scores are:



Rules Corner

How well do you know the new Rules of Golf?

As we are now well into the 2019 golfing year it is timely for us to check on how well we have adapted to the new Rules of Golf and get some idea of our level of understanding of these new rules. The following questions look at some of the changes to the Rules.

- 1. Starting play of the first hole in a stroke play event, James tees the ball in the teeing area about 1 club length behind the tee markers. As he is making his downward stroke, the ball falls off the tee and James barely tips the ball as it is falling, with the ball coming to rest about 50cm in front of where it was initially teed. James re-tees the ball and plays again from the teeing area. What is the ruling?
- a) James gets the general penalty (2 strokes) and lies 4 where his ball finished from his reteed stroke
- b) James gets no penalty, and lies 2 after his re-teed stroke
- c) James' first stroke does not count, and after his re-teed stroke lies 1
- 2. After his stroke from the teeing area, James' ball is embedded in the rough. What is the correct procedure for James?
- a) As the ball is not embedded on a closely mown area, James must either play the ball as it lies or declare the ball unplayable and take penalty relief under Rule 16.3
- b) James is entitled to penalty free relief and must drop the ball as close as possible, not hearer the hole, to the spot where the ball was embedded
- c) James is entitled to penalty free relief and must drop the ball in a relief area (reference point immediately behind the spot the ball is embedded, and within 1 club length of this reference point)
- 3. Mary hits her approach shot on hole 8 into a bunker. Close to where her ball lies in the bunker there is a pile of leaves which will affect her backswing in making her next stroke. Mary carefully removes these leaves before making her stroke. What is the ruling?
- a) Mary is penalised 2 strokes under Rule 8.1 for improving her line for the next stroke
- b) Mary is penalised 1 stroke for touching loose impediments in a bunker
- c) Mary is not penalised
- 4. Ian finds his ball on the 17th fairway close to a sprinkler head which interferes with his stance for his second stroke. He opts to take relief under Rule 16.1 and correctly establishes the relief area that he must drop the ball into. Ian drops the ball from shoulder height, it lands and comes to rest in the relief area. He plays the ball from the relief area and completes the hole in 5 strokes. What is lan's correct score for that hole
- a) 5
- b) 6
- c) 7



Rules Corner

How well do you know the new Rules of Golf?

- 5. Helen playing the first hole strays on to the 13th fairway and her second stroke comes to rest on the fringe of the 13th green. To play her next stroke her stance would be on the 13th green. What is the ruling?
- a) Helen must play the ball as it lies
- b) Helen may take relief under Rule 13.1 (wrong green) or play the ball as it lies
- c) Helen must take relief under Rule 13.1

Rules Corner Answers

- 1. (b) Under Rule 6.2, a ball that is to be played from the teeing area at any time may be played from anywhere in the teeing area and may be re-teed. James first stroke counted with his second stroke the one from the re-teed ball.
- 2. (c) The new rule 16.3 provides for penalty free relief for an embedded ball anywhere in the general area (formerly "through the green"). Under the old rules, penalty free relief for an embedded ball was restricted to a ball embedded in a closely mown area unless a local rule provided for relief "through the green". The new relief procedure requires players to establish a relief area as described in Rule 16.3 into which the ball must be dropped.
- 3. (c) Under the new rule 12.1, players may now remove loose impediments in a bunker (including small stones) without penalty. However, players should exercise caution in doing so, as if the ball moves in the process of removing loose impediments, the player is penalised 1 stroke and the ball must be replaced.
- 4. (b) Ian is penalised 1 stroke for dropping the ball in a wrong way as he played from the correct relief area he incurs no further penalty. Had he re-dropped the ball in the correct way (from knee height) before he played the next stroke Ian could have avoided any penalty
- 5. (c) Under the new Rule 13.1f, players must now take complete relief from a wrong green this includes when the wrong green only causes interference to the player's stance

Health and Safety Corner

When hitting balls on the range and you see a golfer searching for their ball off the 9th & 18th fairway do not hit.

Also be aware of players on the front 9th tee.



COURSE REPORT

March has been a great month weather wise with temperatures in the mid 25's, however, the irrigation pump broke down while I was on holiday. It is a credit to my team for the condition the course is in. James stepped up - comforting to know the course is in good hands. Thank you, James Hart.

Greens are dense, rolling smooth and consistent. Fertilizer, verti cutting as well as top dressed with sand, will continue as per maintenance.

Tees and surrounds to be renovated all going well, weather being the issue. 7th blue tee to be re constructed and levelled to coincide with levelling on the 12th hole tees re alignment.

Fairways have recovered well from dethatching, with the recent pump breakdown meaning areas dried up a little more than we wanted. Will benefit stronger species of grass in the future.

Rough will be sprayed for weeds when possible.

Please continue to repair pitch marks and replace divots, it is a pleasure to see people doing this.

I wish everyone well in upcoming matches in the next month. Hope that all members and visitors enjoy their time at Manawatu Golf Club. Have a great Easter break away, where ever you may be travelling, be safe.

NOTE: The 12th hole reconstruction begins this month, please steer clear when possible.
