MESSAGE FROM THE GENERAL MANAGER AND PRESIDENT

We recently announced Chris Wilson has been appointed to replace Warren and will commence on Wednesday 2 June. We ask that you welcome Chris to the Club and please introduce yourself as he works his way into the role. In the interim Warren will continue albeit remotely handling all the Sub Committee reports and capital items the Club has approved. Sometime in June it is expected the Club will receive the funds from the Riverland Sale and there is the WDCL activity next door which can require quick responses as they battle with their compliance issues. The area within the development will be raised by over a metre with the Club having met with the City Engineer to make sure our drainage systems are not interrupted. The Club representative competitions are well underway for both men and women. We have several pennant teams firing up and some are in the hunt for higher honours. Thank you to all the members who make themselves available to play in all our teams. In total we have approximately 100 members who make themselves available to represent their Club.

The Committee have commissioned Grant Puddicombe from Grant Puddicombe Golf to look at our golf course. Grant has completed a preliminary review and is now working on a full course report. The majority of the course does not require any major alterations. However the issue of safety in certain parts of the course is under scrutiny. The 8th, 9th and 15th fairways have been highlighted by Grant and in his course report he will look to propose different options and then begin to weigh out the pros and cons of each option.

The Grant Puddicombe report falls under the Clubs Strategic Plan. The Leadership and Governance Sub-Committee has been set and shortly a club survey will be populated and sent to members asking for their input.

Tree Removal

For some time we have known the huge old pine trees splitting the 14th & 15th fairways are a "ticking time bomb". The issue of old trees on the golf course was raised at the Annual General Meeting and subsequently the Committee have addressed this issue and agreed to have these removed commencing on Sunday 4 April (Easter Sunday) weather dependent. The stumps will also be removed and taken off site. The contract states, the work will take approximately 10 days weather dependent, start to finish. This is an opportune time to remove the logs out of the property while we have access through the Wallace Development. WDCL have kindly allowed the contractor to exit these logs out through their property which will save the course in the future with some major repair work.

Holes 14 & 15 will be out of action with players having played the 13th hole out will then walk to the 16th tee and all this is because of health & safety reasons. As far as scoring goes, please take (2 points) for each of the two holes you haven't played. This is not permanent but a simple solution to the problem. If progress is smooth and ahead of time within the 10 day period then we will look to open up these holes but more than likely there will be roped off areas.



For the past eight years, the annual Discover Golf programme has been a great way to introduce those new-to-golf to both the game, and the Manawatu Golf Club. With up to 36 participants each year, over 30 Discover Golfers have gone on to join the club since 2020 across a variety of membership categories.

The introductory programme is specifically designed to teach the basics of the short game – putting, shipping, pitching - in a friendly and relaxed environment, all the while building confidence to get participants out on the course and having fun.

Series 1 officially ended last Sunday with a 9-hole Ambrose competition and participants of the 2020 COVID-interrupted programme were also invited to join in the fun. The Discover Golf Series #2 programme begins in May concentrating on full swing with mid-irons and drivers, and bunkers!

Many thanks to the Pro-Shop, Rachel, Warren and the team of volunteers for running another successful programme.

Following on from the Discover Golf, it's a good idea to pop down to the course for practice or to play during the quieter times. These are typically late afternoon on weekdays, after 4pm on Saturdays and most of Sunday. Remember to check online to see if tees are available.

Sunday mornings between 10-10:30am have been reserved for beginner golfers and, in May, a few seasoned golfers have volunteered their time to expand on the DG programme and provide a little more guidance on course etiquette, how to fill in scorecards or answer any other questions you might have. The wonderful Pro Shop team are always willing to help in any way, and the more you play, the more you will want to learn which is a perfect time to get individual lessons from Allan, Andre or Tim.

To ensure a more enjoyable golf experience, the club has developed a few guidelines to assist our beginner golf members:

- Start closer to the green and use the coloured tee blocks as your reference point
- Tee up whenever you want (except for the greens)
- · Drop out of bunkers onto the grass
- If you have reached 8 shots before the green, pick up and place your ball on the green and putt
- Always remember: Your place is behind the people in front, not in front of the people behind.

Finally, learning anything new can be a little daunting so don't think you need to know it all at once. Remember that your game will improve over time and, with the encouragement and support of the club and members, you'll have a whole lot of fun along the way!



Rules Corner

This month we will review the options available when confronted with an unplayable ball. Rule 19 allows a player to choose from options as to how to proceed with an unplayable ball – normally with each option costing one penalty stroke. There are two important general conditions that cover the unplayable ball relief procedures.

- 1. A player may decide to take unplayable ball relief anywhere on the course except when the ball lies in a penalty area.
- 2. The player is the only person who can decide to treat his or her ball as unplayable by taking penalty relief under Rule 19.2 or 19.3.



Relief for unplayable ball in the general area

Diagram 19.2 (taken from the Rules of Golf booklet) illustrates the three options available for a ball declared unplayable in the general area – all of these options incur a 1 stroke penalty


Option 1 is to take stroke and distance, ie play the next stroke from where the previous stroke was played. If played from the general area, the spot must be identified or estimated and a ball dropped in the relief area 1(shaded pink). The reference point for this 1 club length area is the spot (actual or estimated) from where the previous stroke was played. The ball when dropped, must land in and come to rest in this relief area. If the previous stroke was played from the teeing area, the ball may be teed up and played from anywhere in the teeing area.

Option 2 shows how a player may take "back on the line" relief using a reference line going straight back from the hole through the spot of the original ball in its unplayable position. There is no limit as to how far back the player may go on this line. The reference point for determining the relief area 2 (1 club length arc) should be marked with a tee to assist the player ensuring the ball is dropped in and comes to rest in this defined relief area.

Option 3 provides for the player to take "lateral" relief as shown by the shaded pink area 3. The reference point for this relief area (2 club lengths arc) is the spot of the original ball in its unplayable position.

Rules Corner Continued

These options ensure a player always has a means of continuing play. In many cases not all three options will be available to choose from – eg consider a ball unplayable near a boundary fence (which clearly eliminates the "back on the line" option). It is also not uncommon for lateral relief to not provide any relief (say when ball is unplayable in a large spreading bush). Fortunately, the stroke and distance option is always available as a last resort.



Relief for an unplayable ball in a bunker

This diagram illustrates the options available for a ball declared unplayable in a bunker. In this case the player has four options.

Option 1. For 1 penalty stroke, the player may take stroke and distance relief with the same requirements as for relief from the general area with regard to the relief area to play from (shaded pink area 1)

Option 2. For 1 penalty stroke, the player may take back on the line relief in the bunker (shaded pink area 2)

Option 3. For 1 penalty stroke, the player may take lateral relief in the bunker (shaded pink area 3)

Option 4. For a total of 2 penalty strokes, the player may take back on the line relief outside the bunker based on a reference line going straight back from the hole through the spot of the original ball.

The most common confusion I see among our members when confronted with an unplayable option is the notion that a player may drop a ball back on a line from the spot of the unplayable ball to the spot where the previous stroke was played.
