PROPOSED CATEGORY CHANGES UPDATE

The Committee met on September 27, where the 'Membership Category Changes' proposal was discussed in considerable detail. The feedback from the information evening on Monday 19 September with the members was discussed. The Committee also consulted with an Auckland based University professor Dr Geoff Dickson. Geoff has put a lot of research into 'Equality at Golf Clubs' and is an expert in 'Equality in Sport'. He was very impressed with the proposal and very supportive of the direction the Club was looking to go in. The Club has also received statements of strong support from Manawatu-Wanganui Golf and New Zealand Golf, as well as a number of Club members after the information evening.

The Committee has decided that it is in the current members, future members and the Club's best interests to achieve gender equality, including equal playing rights. While the discrimination towards women has typically been accepted within golf clubs, it is the opinion of the Committee that this can no longer occur within the Manawatu Golf Club. We are therefore working through the current proposal to make the necessary changes (including subscription levels) following the feedback from the information evening on Monday 19 September, and will be making a final decision on the new proposal which the Committee will endeavour to communicate to members in the next fortnight.







RIBBONWOOD PLANTED TO THE RIGHT OF THE 15TH TEE BLOCK

Several people have passed comment about the state of the line of shrubs planted along the boundary above the 15th tee blocks.

These plants are NZ Ribbonwood (Maori name Manatu, scientific name *Plagianthus regius*). These shrubs are one of New Zealand's few semi-deciduous tree and are quite hardy tolerating wet and dry conditions and poor soils. They are quite suitable for this area which can become very dry during summer.

What is planted is the juvenile stage and given time will grow into a tall but slender trees.

RULES CORNER

There has been a very positive response to the first part of the R&A quiz from the recent Open Championship featured in our last Rules Corner – this month we will look at the next 6 questions from this quiz – good luck!

Question 1. On hole 7, Robert's ball comes to rest on a sprinkler head (an immovable obstruction) beside the green. He correctly identifies his nearest point of relief and measures the one club-length area in which he drops the ball. The ball then rolls and comes to rest more than two club-lengths from where it first struck the ground. What is the ruling?

- a) Robert must play the ball as it lies
- b) Robert must place the ball at the spot where it first struck the course
- c) The ball has rolled into a situation where a re-drop is required without penalty

Question 2. On the par three eighth hole, John's ball lies on the front edge of the putting green. He putts and his ball strikes the unattended flagstick in the hole on the back level of the green. What is the ruling?

- a) There is no penalty
- b) John is penalised 2 strokes and the ball must be played as it lies
- c) John must cancel the stroke and replay it without penalty

Question 3. On the ninth hole, Robert has a short putt for par. Holding the flagstick in one hand he holes the short putt by gripping the putter with his other hand. What is the ruling?

- a) There is no penalty
- b) Robert is penalised 2 strokes
- c) Robert is disqualified

Question 4. On the tenth hole, John hits his tees shot towards the OB fence on the right, and believing this ball may be OB, he hits a provisional ball which he believes is in play. However, when he gets to the search area, he finds both his original and the provisional balls are out of bounds. He returns to the tee and puts another ball in play. How many strokes has he now played?

- a) 3
- b) 4
- c) 5

Question 5. On the par 3 eleventh hole, both Robert's and John's balls are close together in the same bunker. Robert marks and lifts his ball to enable John to play his stroke. John's stroke leaves a big splash mark in the sand, altering the lie of Robert's ball. What is the ruling?

- a) John incurs a penalty of 2 strokes for altering the lie
- b) There is no penalty and Robert must accept the altered lie
- c) There is no penalty and the lie must be re-created.

RULES CORNER ... continued

Question 6. On the twelfth hole, before Robert plays his second stroke from the fairway, John voluntarily shows him what he has been doing wrong on his backswing and how to correct it. Robert objects to this. What is the ruling?

- a) There is no penalty to either player
- b) Robert incurs a 2 stroke penalty for this advice from John
- c) John incurs a 2 stroke penalty for giving advice

RULES CORNER ANSWERS

Question 1. (c) Under Rule 20-2c, a dropped ball must be re-dropped if it rolls and comes to rest more than 2 club-lengths from where it first struck a part of the course. Robert must re-drop the ball without penalty.

Question 2. (b) Rule 17-3 clearly states a ball must not strike the unattended flagstick if the stroke is made from on the putting green.

Question 3. (a) Rule 17-2 and Decision 17-1/5 clarify this situation. Provided the player has removed the flagstick from the hole and the ball does not strike the flagstick, there is no penalty. If the ball had struck the flagstick, Robert would have been in breach of Rule 17-3a and incurred a 2 stroke penalty.

Question 4. (c) Under Rule 27-1, a stroke played with a provisional ball and any penalty related to it is not disregarded unless the provisional ball is abandoned (ie the original ball is found in bounds). The third ball played from the tee becomes the ball in play and he has now played 5.

Question 5. (c) Refer to Rules 27-2 and 20-3b. There is no penalty and Robert must recreate the original lie and replace his ball.

Question 6. (c) Rule 8-1. At no time may a player seek or give advice to another player in a competition on the course. The definition of advice states "Advice is any counsel or suggestion that could influence a player in determining his play, the choice of a club or the method of making a stroke". Robert in this case did not seek advice thus is not at fault. John incurs the penalty for voluntarily offering advice to Robert.
