MORTGAGE LINK MANAWATU OPEN

The Mortgage Link Manawatu Open was played Sunday 18 October at the Manawatu Golf Club in very wet, spring conditions. Consistent overnight rain softened the course and with the rain continuing throughout the morning, the end result was a few of the greens starting to flood. But with a number of volunteers on 'squeegee' duty, play was able to continue with the rain easing into the afternoon. Considering the amount of rain the course was in magnificent condition.

Marton Golf Club member and defending champion Lachie McDonald got off to a slow start with a three over par 75 in the tough windy, wet conditions. That was still only two shots off the pace with surprise leader Manawatu Golf Club's Regan McConaghty opening with a 73. Manawatu's Rhys Watkins was only one off the pace with a 74 as was Taranaki visitor Zach Lewis.

In the afternoon conditions became no easier with the wind intensifying. Joseph Doyle from Taranaki backed up his morning round of 75 with another 75 to post a two round total of 150. Watkins slipped off the pace with an afternoon 78 and so did Lewis who blew out with an 82. McDonald could only manage a second round 78 and would eventually finish tied for sixth. But it was going to be McConaghty's day who ground out a four over par 76 to post a winning score of five over par 149. This was the first major tournament win for the Manawatu Golf Club Academy member.

In the Women's Open, it was a one horse race with Manawatu member Maraea Durie shooting back to back 74's to win the women's section by 19 shots. Durie who is recently back from completing four years on a Golf scholarship in the US was too classy for her rivals. Her even par total over the two rounds was very impressive considering the conditions.

Second place went to young Katherine Paskins from Palmerston North Golf Club who had rounds of 84 and 83. Third was Manawatu's Emma Clayton who was making a comeback to tournament Golf after a quiet year.

Over all 88 Golfers took to the fairways over 36 holes in the last event on the Manawatu-Wanganui Order of Merit.

RULES CORNER

There has been considerable discussion recently within the Club as to what is permissible and not permissible in a bunker.

This month we will look at some situations that commonly cause confusion regarding play from a bunker.



- 1. John is playing a stroke round and on the 18th and hits his third shot into the large bunker on the left of the green. His ball has finished close to the greenside edge of the bunker and to save time, he picks up the rake and takes it close to where his ball is and places it in the bunker before making his stroke from the bunker. From this stroke, the ball lands on the green and from there he 2 putts to complete the hole. What is John's true score for that hole?
 - a) 6
- b) 7
- c) 8
- 2. Harry is playing in a stroke event and on the 14th hole, hits his 3rd shot into the bunker guarding the front left of the green his ball has come to rest near the greenside lip and his entry point is from the mid left margin of the bunker. After picking up the rake and prior to entering the bunker Harry notices an area in the bunker near his entry point that has clearly been disturbed by a dog. He enters the bunker and repairs this area with the rake before proceeding to his ball to play his next stroke, which he successfully plays to within 1 metre from the hole, and 1 putts to complete the hole. What is Harry's true score for this hole?
 - a) 5
- b) 6
- c) 7
- 3. Paul is playing in a stroke event and hits his second shot on the 3rd hole into the front right greenside bunker. He is undecided which of his three wedges he needs to play his next stroke so takes the three wedges with him into the bunker, decides to play his lob wedge and places the other 2 wedges in the sand near his ball. He successfully plays his next stroke onto the green and 2 putts to complete the hole. What is Paul's true score for the hole?
 - a) 5
- b) 6
- c) 7
- 4. William playing in a stroke event hits his 2nd shot on hole 9 into the loose sand on the face of the greenside bunker. He finds a ball almost completely "buried" and as the identification marks on his ball are not visible, he is unable to identify the ball as his. He carefully scrapes away some sand covering the ball which allows him to identify the ball as his, but in this process his ball moves about 1cm from its original position. Before playing his next shot, he replaces the ball, re-creates the original lie and covers the ball with sand leaving a small portion of the ball visible. Has William incurred any penalty?
 - a) Yes 1 stroke
- b) Yes 2 strokes
- c) No
- 5. Mary is playing a stroke round in the autumn. She hits her tee shot on hole 8 into the front right bunker. When she reaches the bunker, there is no sign of her ball but there is a large pile of leaves in one part of the bunker. Mary reasonably assumes her ball is somewhere in the leaves in the bunker. In the process of searching among the leaves, Mary finds and causes her ball to move 2cm from its original position. She replaces the ball, covers the ball with leaves leaving a small portion of the ball visible, then plays her next stroke on to the green. What is Mary's true score after her bunker shot?

- c) 4




