PRO SHOP UPDATE

The Committee is aware that there is still a bit of 'talk' amongst the members about this decision but wants to assure members that things are progressing well behind the scenes. The Club is working towards a smooth transition and Andre & Alan have been very helpful with this.

Before making this decision the Committee completed a thorough due diligence process which included a comprehensive review of the current business as well as visiting a number of other Clubs to discuss their Pro Shop and Golf Operations structures.

Things the club have been working on include; finding the extra staff to compliment Alan and Andre (one of these new staff members should be announced shortly), touching base with suppliers who will supply the shop from August 1 and working on what the point of sale system will be to ensure committees and members can be provided with adequate information about the pro shop performance.

There have been three common questions/queries that we have been hearing through the grapevine.

- 1. There has been a lack of communication to the members? We will/have endeavoured to let the members know as much as possible and will continue to do so through the newsletter. As members can understand, with a changeover like this some things have to remain commercially sensitive.
- 2. How much is this costing the club to do? This is one of the things that remains commercially sensitive at this stage. The committee is comfortable it has operated within its delegated authority much like the committee in 2011 when the Bar and Catering decision was made.
- 3. Retail is hard these days? We agree that retail is difficult these days in the age of the Internet but fortunately the pro shop business is much more than selling Golf clubs. Services such as coaching, range balls, club hires, cart hires and corporate activities/services all help to supplement the financial viability of such operation.

We expect the changeover to be relatively smooth and have no great impact on the members.

If any members have any questions around incorporating the Pro Shop to the Golf Club, we suggest you approach Mike Williams, General Manager who will answer the questions he is able to.

SAFE TRAVELS BILLY

Billy Burnley, one of our course staff has just finished with the club to go on his OE. Billy has been working with the Green Staff for about 12 months and will be travelling through the UK with his partner. We thank Billy for his work over the past year and wish him well.



RULES CORNER

This month we will look at some interesting rules situations that have arisen in recent professional golf tournaments in the USA.

The **first example** involved Jason Day when he hit his second shot on the closing hole at Harbour Town into the bunker guarding the front of the green. His ball was found to be completely embedded in the face of the bunker and clearly in an unplayable position. He declared the ball unplayable. Which of the following option(s) were available to Jason (all under a penalty of one stroke).

- a) Drop a ball within 2 club lengths of its embedded position the ball must be dropped in the bunker
- b) Drop a ball outside the bunker on a line defined by the point where the ball lay and the hole with no limit to how far behind the bunker, the ball may be dropped.
- c) Proceed under stroke and distance by playing a ball as nearly as possible at the spot from which the original ball was last played (Jason's second shot).

The **second example** involved Louis Oosthuizen at the Masters playing one of the classic par fives, number 13. His second shot ended up in shallow water in Rae's Creek – he decided it was playable from this regular water hazard (yellow line and/or stakes). In the process of making his backswing to play this stroke he unknowlingly brushed the water surface. His third stroke resulted in the ball landing on the green from where he 2 putted for what he believed at the time was a 5. He proceeded to complete his round and signed his card with the score of 5 for hole 13. Subsequent television views of the incident showed he had in fact touched the water surface on his backswing which would automatically incur a 2 stroke penalty. What penalty if any, should the committee have imposed?

- a) Disqualification as he recorded and signed for an incorrect hole score for hole number 13
- b) No penalty as the breach was not observed or known at the time of play
- c) 2 stroke penalty with his score for that round adjusted to include the additional 2 strokes.

The **third example** involved Jordan Spieth in the final round during his misfortunes on the famous par three 12th hole. As you will have all seen, his tee shot was weak and right, landing on the greenside bank over the water hazard line and rolling back into the water hazard and water. What options were available to him in this situation?

- a) Play his third stroke from the tee (stroke and distance penalty)
- b) Play from the designated drop zone playing third stroke
- c) Drop a ball behind the water hazard keeping the point at which the original ball last crossed the margin of the water hazard directly between the hole and the spot on which the ball is dropped no limit as to how far behind the water hazard the ball is dropped playing third stroke.
- d) Drop a ball no nearer the hole within 2 club lengths of the spot where the ball last crossed the margin of the water hazard (on the greenside of the hazard)

RULES CORNER ... continued

The **fourth example** follows from Jordan's decision to proceed under option (c) above and again we all saw how he chunked his third shot which also ended up in the water hazard. What is the correct reference point for Jordan to use in deciding on the place to drop a ball for his 5th stroke?

- a) The point on the green side of the hazard where the original tee shot last crossed the margin of the water hazard
- b) The point on the fairway side of the hazard where the third shot crossed the margin of the water hazard

RULES CORNER - ANSWERS

Example 1. (a) and (c). If an unplayable ball is in a bunker and the player opts to proceed as described in (b), a ball must be dropped in the bunker. See Rule 28. Note also the rule states **a** ball not necessarily **the** ball which permits substitution of a ball if necessary.

Example 2. (c). The important issue in this case is the player was unaware that he had in fact brushed the water surface during his backswing – subsequent television views had to be repeatedly viewed in ultra-slow motion to confirm his club had touched the water. Thankfully, in normal club play this kind of scrutiny of each stroke does not occur – and unless noted by playing partners, this kind of indiscretion would be missed. The new changes to Rule 6-6d introduced in January 2016 allow for a 2 stroke penalty to be applied to the score for hole 13 and Oosthuizen's total for that round was adjusted accordingly. Prior to the rule change, the penalty could have been disqualification.

Example 3. (a), (b) and (c). Option (d) is only available for relief from a lateral water hazard (marked by red lines and or stakes)

Example 4. (b). The **reference point** when a ball finishes in a water hazard is always the point **where the ball last crossed** the margin of the hazard – in Spieth's case, this was where his third shot crossed the hazard margin. He was entitled to drop a ball for his 5th shot near to where he had played his third shot because the line of the ball flight for his third shot was directly toward the hole but only just managed to reach the water hazard. Thus the second reference point and the first reference point were virtually on the same line.

While it is appreciated that we do not have water hazards on our course, I have deliberately chosen these examples to encourage our members to be familiar with the rules applicable to water hazards. When playing on courses with water hazards, our members could find themselves at a serious disadvantage if they are not clear on the correct procedures to follow when water hazards come into play. Read Rule 26 carefully.


