

PROSHOP UPDATE

The much anticipated Pro Shop changeover is now here! This has been happening behind the scenes for a number of months and is an exciting step for the Club to take. Firstly we must acknowledge and thank Andre White for contracting his services and business to the Club for the past 11 years. Andre has also been a huge help with implementing this change and as stated many times before in this newsletter we are very happy to have him on board going forward.



We can also now announce some of the changes that will be in place from August 3 when we re-open. A number of comments and feedback have and will be taken on board from the recent Club survey with regards to the Pro Shop.

Firstly we will have an extra staff member (total 4) instead of the traditional three team members. We hope this will increase the service that we can offer from essentially the front door of the Club.

Alan Hyatt becomes the 'Director of Golf' and his main roles will include but are not limited to the following;

- Managing the Pro Shop (including the retail and the Pro Shop staff)
- Director of Coaching (Alan will continue to coach as well)
- Working closely with the Match Committee/other golf Committees to deliver the best possible Golf services/events for the members and as previously stated Alan will be out there on Saturday's playing with the members.

Andre will be focussing on coaching and running our corporate day events. Regan McConaghty will be undertaking the NZPGA apprenticeship and working in the shop and coaching juniors. Christine will be working in the shop and providing great service to members.

The Committee has decided to offer members a discount on Golf products in the shop of 7.5% off the RRP. This is similar to the café and bar where members are asked to swipe their card or state their membership number to receive the discount. We hope this will encourage members to support the Pro Shop as every cent of profit will go back into your Golf Club in one form or another.

We are very lucky to have two of the best coaches in New Zealand and we want as many members to make the most of this opportunity as possible. 30 minute Individual lessons with Alan or Andre will cost \$49.00. We are also introducing an under 16 lesson rate of \$29.00. Junior Golf is a really important focus for the Club and this new lesson rate for them will hopefully get more kids developing their game which will have long term benefits for the Club and Golf. There will be lesson packages available where if you pay up front for 6 lessons your 7th one is free, and if you buy 10 your 11th and 12th are free. We will also have a stamp card system where you can have your card clipped after each lesson and your 8th lesson is free.

Members also have an opportunity to add to your membership and become a 'Practice Range Member'. For \$295.00 for an individual or \$445.00 for two members of the same family you can have unlimited Golf Balls on the range for a year as well as some other benefits. See the poster in this newsletter for a full list of benefits, an early bird special and conditions. We have also extended the last time you can get a bucket from 4.30pm to 4.45pm.

We are also pleased to announce that our main suppliers of clubs to the Pro Shop will now include PING and Mizuno. They will be an addition to the current suppliers of Titleist, Callaway, Cobra Puma and Taylormade. We will be exclusive suppliers to our region with Taylormade and Callaway.

Our opening special for members from Wednesday 3 August through to Friday August 12 is 20% off all Clothing and Shoes. This is a fantastic offer so make sure you get in and see Alan and the team about this. If we don't have your size or style just ask and I am sure we can get it for you.

A number of positive things are happening in this area and we are sure members will get in behind and support this new venture for the Club. Remember that every dollar spent in the shop will go back into making your Club better!

CLUB SURVEY

Thank you to all members who took the time to participate in the recent Club survey. In all we had 339 surveys returned which is a good sample to get some useful information. The overall feeling from the survey results was that members are generally pretty happy with the Club and the facilities/services on offer.

Some key points per section below:

Responses

257 Men responded to the survey and 82 Women. The length of time that the respondents had been a member was relatively equal across the 'range options'

Over 90% of new members to the Club who returned a survey said the Club was 'meeting their expectations' or 'exceeding their expectations'.

Carts

Carts are growing in demand and this will continue. A number on the survey indicated they would like to store a cart or hire one more regularly. Based on this the Committee will look closely at a cart policy throughout the rest of this year.

Communication

An overwhelming percentage are happy with the amount of communication that the Club is putting out.

Bar and Catering

The clubhouse operations received a lot of positive comments and good ratings across the different areas. See the table below for these.

Pro Shop

Everyone will be hoping that the next order-of-merit event, the Ricoh Wanganui Open on August 21st at Belmont golf course has much better weather conditions!



ARE YOU READY FOR RETIREMENT? - Part 2/3

"Research shows that many are leaving their retirement plans to the last minute"

This is the second in a series of 'Are you ready for retirement?' articles.

The first article can be found in June's newsletter.

Gavin and Jenny look at each other before posing the question we know is coming. "What do you mean we have a 25% probability that we can retire now?"

At this point, we have to jump in.

"It's not that you have a 25% probability of being able to retire. You have a 100% probability of being able to retire. That choice is totally yours. Our job is just to ensure your portfolio will provide you with the retirement you want, and it's our job to be honest no matter what. As we run the numbers, it doesn't add up. But don't worry, there's good news coming..."

"What's the good news?" Gavin interjects with a smirk. Let's just take a step back and review...

Gavin was a successful executive and had worked his way up to the top of his division. With that came increased income and improved lifestyle. However, stress was the unwelcome companion and now Gavin wanted to walk away, earlier than planned. That's why they were talking to us.

Gavin and Jenny are both 60 so they are looking at five years of higher withdrawals (taking them to age 65), and then 30 years of lower withdrawals (thanks to government superannuation). They both feel 95 is a very generous life expectancy – unfortunately, both sets of parents have passed away, none living past age 86.

All the above looks achievable, and indeed it may be. But we know that the future is uncertain. So, rather than Gavin and Jenny simply crossing their fingers and hoping for the best, we can look at the probability that a portfolio invested in 60% shares and 40% bonds can produce the planned withdrawals and leave their two children the estate they're hoping.

And the answer is...it's unlikely to. We calculate the probability at approximately 25%, which is far too low – Gavin and Jenny want at least 75% certainty built into their plans.

That can perhaps be summarised as the bad news, but we prefer to call it the honest reality. Fortunately, there's a path forward. You see, as much as Gavin and Jenny want a definite lifestyle and to leave an estate, they also have flexibility.

For example, we ask Gavin and Jenny, "you'd like to leave an estate of \$400,000, in today's dollars, for your children. Is that set in stone or is there some flexibility there?"

Gavin cuts in, "Yes". But Jenny looks less sure.

Gavin, sensing his wife's uneasiness, says, "listen honey, we're leaving them the house. That's paid for and worth at least \$750,000 now, and it may increase in value."

Jenny responds, "true, but I'd like to leave at least \$100,000 in the portfolio for each of them, to tide them over until the property settles."

Gavin turns to us, "I agree. But yes, we do have some flexibility with that one."

It turns out that, when we pose the question properly, they have flexibility on most items.

It was now obvious to everyone in the room that certain factors just meant a lot more to Gavin and Jenny than others. And in order to do our job properly, we really need to understand that.

"Gavin and Jenny, you've done a great job thinking through your flexibility here. But it's clear to everyone that some of these items are a higher priority than others. Let's talk about your priorities. Of all the above, what's the most important factor to making your retirement what you most want it to be?"

First and foremost, they have no more money to put into the portfolio. This is everything. There's no flexibility there. We rank that number one, for obvious reasons.

For the next highest priority, the tone of Gavin's voice says it all. Work is a stress. He exclaims, "I feel if I work another two years, I'll live five less."

Check. 'Retire now' goes next on the list. And since they can't save if they're retired, we put that factor with it.

This wasn't an easy conversation. As is often the case, husband and wife have different priorities and have never really discussed them. However, putting everything on the table, Gavin and Jenny were very accepting about what the other wanted. We're told that some of the most honest conversations partners have, occur in our offices. It's just about asking the right questions.

And here's the good news for Gavin and Jenny. "Not only can you retire, but you can retire right now, with high confidence your portfolio can provide for you." The look on Gavin's face says it all, "Thank you!"

Jenny looks at Gavin, genuinely pleased with how happy he is, "but how?"

Ah, let's explain that...in our next article.

VODAFONE MENS' CLUB CHAMPS 2016

The two rounds of qualifying for Men's Club Champs are on Saturday August 13th and Saturday August 20th. These are stroke rounds (so there are no gimmes).

You will qualify based on your best **gross** round over these two Saturdays. Morning players can enter as per the normal start sheet however if play is cancelled due to frosts, bad luck.

There are club draws for those who wish to play in the afternoons, entry as per "Event Registration" page on the Manawatu Golf Club's webpage http://www.manawatugolfclub.com/members-area/

When getting your card you must press the "Qualifying" button on the touch screen.

Seniors (up to 8.5 handicap index) play off the Black tees, all other grades play off Blue tees.

For the club draws we will do our best to match players of similar handicap index.

We will **not** honour any requests for playing partners or tee preference.

We will try to alternate start tees over the 2 rounds, e.g. seniors off 1st tee in round 1 and 10th tee in round 2.

If you are planning that long overdue holiday in September or October then please don't enter as no dispensations will be given during the rounds.

The top 16 in each grade qualify for the Main draw (matches played of the stick), and the next 16 qualify for the Handicap draw (shots given based on handicap). First round losers in either the Main or Handicap draws enter Flights (left hand side of draw sheets in Card room).


We suggest you organise and try and play your matches early.

Qualifying scores were very tight in 2015, for example in the intermediate grade there were 7 scores of 85 which was the "cut". Tied scores are ranked by count back from the 18th hole, so in 2015 four players with 85 qualified in the top 16. The Vice Club Captain missed out due to a double bogey on the 17th!

Round 1 matches to be played by 18 September, round 2 and round 1 flights by 15 October. Semi-finals and semi-final flights to be played by 30 October. All finals to be played on Sunday 6th November at times provided by the match committee.

This year major finals (Senior (<9 handicap), Intermediate (9 to 15 handicap), Junior (16 to 20 handicap) and C-grade finals (21 to 40 handicap) are all to be played over 36 holes with the other matches played over 18 holes.

RULES CORNER

This month we will run a short quiz to revise some situations covered over the last 18 months in this forum – all aimed at getting everyone ready for the forthcoming club championship qualifying rounds.

It is also worth repeating here the basic piece of advice regarding the game – *Play the ball as it lies, play the course as you find it, and if you cannot do either, do what is fair. But to do what is fair, you need to know the Rules of Golf.*

Question 1. John is playing a qualifying round with Ian acting as his caddie. John plays his third stroke from a greenside bunker and the ball comes to rest above the tip of the hole and against the flagstick. Ian, in his excitement, carelessly removes the flagstick and causes John's ball to move about 10cm from the hole. The ruling is:

- a) John is penalised 1 stroke and must play the ball as it lies
- b) John is penalised 1 stroke, must place the ball on the lip of the hole and putt out
- c) John is penalised 1 stroke and the ball is considered holed
- d) John incurs no penalty the ball is considered holed
- e) John incurs no penalty. He must replace the ball on the lip of the hole and putt out

Question 2. Simon is playing in a stroke event. While searching for his ball, he accidently stands on it leaving the ball embedded. What is the correct procedure?

- a) No penalty Simon should proceed under the local rule covering an embedded ball through the green
- b) Simon incurs a 1 stroke penalty and then proceeds under the embedded ball local rule
- c) Simon incurs a 1 stroke penalty. He must place the ball within 1 club length of the original position that has the most similar lie

Question 3. Tim and Bill are playing a match. Both balls lie on the putting green – Bill marks his ball first and as he steps back, he accidently moves Tim's ball. What is the ruling?

- a) No penalty to either player, Tim must replace his ball
- b) No penalty to either player, Tim must play his ball from its new position
- c) Bill is penalised 1 stroke and Tim must replace his ball

Question 4. In a qualifying round, James hits his tee shot into the trees on the LHS of the 2nd fairway. After searching for 3 minutes without finding the ball, he decides to go back to the tee to hit a provisional ball leaving his playing partners to continue searching for his original ball. After hitting his provisional ball and on his way back to join the group, his original ball is found just inside the 5 minute search time. James proceeds to hole out in 5 strokes with his original ball and then completes his round. Later in the clubhouse, the committee are made aware of these events. What action should the committee take?

- a) Let James score as returned stand
- b) Impose a 2 stroke penalty on James for hitting a wrong ball
- c) Disqualify James for not holing out on the second hole with the correct ball

RULES CORNER ANSWERS

Question 1. (e) See Rule 17-4. The ball resting against the flagstick above the level of the hole is NOT holed – if the player, or another person authorised by the player, carefully removes the flagstick to allow the ball to fall into the hole, then the player is deemed to have holed out with his previous stroke. If the ball is *moved* it must be placed on the lip of the hole without penalty.

Question 2. (c)) See Rule 20-3b. When Simon stood on the ball, he caused it to move (movement can be vertical as well as horizontal) and under Rule 18-2 he incurs a penalty of 1 stroke – he must replace the ball and as his actions altered the original lie, he must proceed under Rule 20-3b and place the ball at the nearest lie most similar to the original lie that is not nearer the hole, within 1 club length of the original lie and not in a hazard. He cannot proceed under the embedded ball rule as the ball was not embedded in its own pitch mark.

Question 3. (c) See Rule 18-3c. Bill caused Tim's ball to move in an "other than search" situation thus he incurs a 1 stroke penalty and Tim must replace his ball. With the increased use of carts on our course – it is important the players driving same exercise extreme care to avoid accidently running over an opponent's ball – as they would incur the same penalty that Bill suffered. In stroke play, if a ball is moved by a fellow competitor, no penalty applies and the moved ball must be replaced.

Question 4. (c) The second ball James played from the tee was NOT a provisional ball – see Rule 27-2. This second ball became the ball in play as soon as James hit it from the tee and he is required to abandon his original ball (even if found inside the 5 minute search time) and proceed with the second ball. His failure to do this and not correcting his mistake before hitting from the next tee automatically incurs the ultimate penalty – disqualification.
