Thank you to all the MGC Staff too, who went above and beyond — we are very lucky to have great people in our team.

I am sure Bos' Club Captain's report in this newsletter will feature some very proud comments about the Pennants teams making the finals this



month. Pennants is Bos' special project this year, and to quote the man himself about these results and the culture the pennants teams have built Bos would say, "If I was any better, I couldn't stand it". Thanks to our members who are very gracious when they need to make other plans to enjoy golf. We know you joined the MGC to play the MGC course - James is doing his best to ensure the balance between events, pennants bookings, and members' golf heavily prioritises in our members' favour.

I have established a new Range Development Sub Committee (RDSC) to conduct a feasibility study into developing a new Range and possible

associated changes to practice facilities and realignment of the 9th hole. Let me emphasise that at this stage it is just to ascertain the potential golfing, financial, and member benefits that could be possible if we were to undertake such a major project. The FCC are very aware of some of the concerns and threats that events like balls exiting our boundaries (particularly on the 9th), the risk (and frustration) of cars crossing the 9th fairway and the restrictions on drivers on the range. We are working toward planning for a development that could address all the aforementioned concerns. In addition, we would also love to see the integration of tech on the range to provide great data for our members and a fantastic teaching hub for our Club Pros to continue to deliver high-quality lessons and programmes. It is easy to think "The course has been here 125 years, why do we need to change" or "People coming to the course need to give way to the golfers," but I believe times are changing and the MGC needs to be proactive, not reactive, and stay ahead of the game. We cannot celebrate (and rely) on the money the visitors to the club spend in the café and golf shop, and then in the same breath turn round and curse them for not looking 250 metres to the left to see if anyone is on the 9th tee as they enter the course! There are some really exciting options on the table and once the RDSC have processed the information, and completed a deep dive into feasibility, we will definitely share this with the membership.

I have loved my recent Friday night dining at the club — if you haven't tried it, you must. The food is sensational, but you must try the cocktails. As I am an athlete, I don't order dessert, but Karen and I were tempted to try a Rose Bud — these are unbelievably good, and the first taste resulted in a simultaneous "Whoa!" The ladies ended up having a second and this was a perfect way to finish a lovely meal.

In this newsletter there is a variety of great info about a range of important and exciting issues relating to our club. These topics vary from sponsorship to the selection of tap beer, Holes in One to pennants results, Instagram engagement to Autumn mixers. There has been a real effort over the last 12 months to up our game in terms of communication with our members. GENERAL MANAGER'S REPORT

Wow! April was a busy month with a lot of successful events hosted by the MGC — we really appreciate the support and understanding of our members, especially for events like the Super 6's, which place a huge demand on the course and the club. We have also had a number of other great initiatives take off in April: The Masters Monday — which was enjoyed by over 50 members; the Autumn Mixer is always super fun; a sold-out Tailored NZ Par 3 Event; and the Generation Next tournament, which mixed young/old golfers, were all great successes. Thanks to all who make these events such great fun — I believe we really are a club that **members enjoy and are proud of.**

The hosting of the Super 6's needed a wide range of elements to be great, for it to be considered a success. These essential elements included:

- A fantastic group of volunteers to ensure the smooth running and hosting of a large event.
- The understanding of a membership to share the course with a field of 77 players who had exclusive access to the MGC Course.
- A championship-level course presented with greens, fairways, tees, rough, gardens, etc. all up to the highest standards demanded by Golf NZ.
- Sponsors who ensure the event is not just viable, but creates an income stream for the club to justify the number of hours and the amount of effort put in.
- The support of the sponsors and committee to try something new with the Pro-Am (Hole in One) and Pro-Am Shootout (Calcutta, prize pool, etc.).
- The support of the membership for this event in the form of attendance at the event so they can enjoy the highest level of golf by great PGA pros and aspiring amateurs.
- A strong relationship with Golf NZ.
- Great weather.
- A local winner!

I can genuinely say that we met and exceeded every one of these essential elements. This resulted in an extremely successful event which received very positive feedback from sponsors (locked in for 2 more years); Golf NZ ("one of the best events on the Charles Tour"); and was enjoyed by large crowds of members, particularly on the Sunday Super 6's where one of our favourite



players (Tyler Hodge) won his first Charles Tour Event. Nick Voke, who has played all around the world, compared our fairways to those he played on the Korn Ferry Tour in the US! Golf NZ acknowledged that the culture of a club can be measured by both the level of engagement and the warmth of the welcome extended to the tournament guests. On both these KPIs, Golf NZ confirmed that the MGC is a fantastic host of a Charles Tour Event.

I hope the Super 6's is indeed something our members enjoy and are proud of. Members will have the opportunity to give their feedback on the Super 6's value to the club in next month's MGC Annual Survey. In terms of a financial return to the club, we will be able to report this next month — but we are on track for a \$15k + profit.

Ops Plan Update

Communication Focus

The past 12 weeks has seen the MGC successfully migrate from a not-fit-for-purpose Facebook page to an engaging and manageable platform. I am pleased and proud of the improved content and usability. We have also dramatically increased our engagement through Instagram, 680 followers compared to 36 in January. Now

that we are tracking in the right direction with our Socials, our attention turns to our webpage, which is in desperate need of a review and revamp.

Sponsorship

The purpose of sharing this information is to acknowledge the significant investment these businesses make in the club, and to also advertise new opportunities for both individuals and businesses to join the sponsorship team. As mentioned earlier in the year, sponsorship is a \$100k budget line in our accounts and although absolutely vital, not \$1 is taken for granted.

Staffing

We welcome Matt Borren, who will join the green's team as a greenkeeper labourer on May 11th. Matt is a keen golfer, talented cricketer, and has a passion and interest in turf.

The kitchen team farewelled Sam (Chef) on April 26th. Matthew (previously Head Chef at Beaver and Bear) will join the team on May 6th. The FOH team farewelled Kauri on April 21st.

The Golf Shop farewelled Guy Perry, but he has since returned on a short-term casual basis — it is always great to see Guy in the shop. A more permanent departure is planned for Hannah on May 6th. We have enjoyed working with Hannah and have appreciated the impact she has made, particularly with the Juniors and Secondary School girls' group. We are now on the recruitment drive for a key team member to join our wonderful Golf Shop team.

May is another positive month for the club in Manawatū Golf Club Nev terms of events and golf. The B Grade Championship has moved to May 5th (from a traditional Oct/Nov date). This is a straight swap with the Manawatu Open as this event is an OOM event for Man Wang selection and the goal is to grow the entries for both the events. For the B Grade this has been a successful change, with 82 entries so far (in the past because of the format we have had to limit to 64). May is also the time for Mother's Day Sunday, which is traditionally one of our busiest days of the year for the café (book early). Add in the Trivia Night, the Junior Masters, the Calcutta and the BMW Owners Golf Day, and there is plenty to look forward to.

Thank you for your support with all of the above. We have a wonderful team (staff, members, sponsors, and volunteers included) who deliver our busy golf programme so well. 

TAP BEER ANALYSIS

Members may be interested about how we make decisions about our Tap Beer at the Manawatu Golf Club.

We have 9 taps in total. We have a contract with DB to have 4 of their 700 beers on tap (one being the proprietary Heineken tap), and we have a contract with Lion to have 4 of their beers on tap. The contract includes benefits such as sponsorship for tournaments and MGC events (Opening/Closing Day, Xmas Cheer, and Par 3). This leaves us 1 tap that we can rotate seasonal kegs or try new product. Over the last 6 months we have tried Panhead Super Charger and Zephyr Alcoholic Lemonade. Both have been quite successful, with Panhead now on a permanent tap. Each month we consider the options on tap and base decisions on a range of factors, including how much of each product we are selling, upcoming events, national trends as advised by our reps, and advice from the Hospo industry. An example of this industry advice is that we have great support and advice from MGC members like Tim Adlam (Speights Ale House) and Brendan Hapeta (Aberdeen).

We always try to offer a variety of products, including lagers, mid ales, low carb, premium, and craft beers. We do also consider local favourites.



Tap Beer MGC 2024

The best performing beers, in terms of volume, are kept on tap, and for MGC this includes Heineken, Export 33, and Speight Mid Ale. This month we replaced the Speights Old Dark with Speights Summit as industry feedback indicated this is one of the most popular beers on the market in NZ. The Zephyr was replaced by the Panhead Supercharger. Whenever we take a beer off tap, we ensure we still stock it in bottles to allow members and guests to continue to drink their favourite brew.

If you have any suggestions about a beer or cider you would like the club to consider for the 9th tap, please do let Bruce or one of the team know. If you are a Tui or Becks drinker, it could be a close-run race to see which is the 8th most popular beer in the club over the next few months....

COURSE NEWS

Congratulations to all those involved in running a successful Brian Green Super 6's event. Thank you to all the volunteers involved. April was a busy month, with Easter, Super 6's, Par 3 tournament, and usual business. The course was in excellent condition throughout.

We have just Vertidrained the greens with 12mm solid tines to a depth of around 250mm. We then rolled, then top dressed with dune sand. In the coming weeks, tees and surrounds are to be cored, fairways are to be dethatched/verticut, drains are to be installed, and bunkers to be worked on when time allows.

I'm sure by now everyone has noticed the rough looking a bit off — I am trying to knock all of the foreign grasses throughout the course, e.g. summer grass, kikuyu, couch. In doing this, the rough is being sprayed with a mixture of herbicide to knock the grasses (leaving mostly fescue) and weeds throughout. We are trying to promote more fescue; this will be less maintenance. We haven't been able to get all the rough yet, so will continue to do so.

The apprentices will be off to their block courses this month. Daniel and Kyle have started their book work. Matthew Pretious is going well and is into his Level 4 assessments. It is a pleasure to be able to have three young and enthusiastic team members learning the industry. This will benefit the club in years to come.

Thank you to all those players that rake the bunkers after they have been in them as this helps the following players. Thank you to all those who replace their divots and repair their pitch marks. Now the cooler temperatures are coming, please watch where you are walking (slopes — e.g. 4th Blue tee, 9th bank to the fairway), and also where you are driving golf carts as growth slows, recovery becomes harder, and turf thins.

The greenkeeping team wish everyone well in their month of golfing.
