



### **Rules Corner**

As this will be our last Rules Corner before we face the new Rules of Golf in the New Year, it is timely to consider how well we are prepared for the new conditions under which we will all play this great game. It was pleasing to see about 50 members attend one of the two presentations on the new Rules of Golf at the club on November 20 and the 25 nine hole members that attended an earlier on-course practical session – and I am hopeful those that attended will form a nucleus of members able to "spread the word" on the new rules as we play under these rules in 2019. In addition, the Player's Edition of the Rules of Golf booklet is now available from the club and all members are encouraged to collect one of these. They are in the draw under the score-screen in the café and the card room.



As part of the process of preparing for play at the MGC in 2019, the current Local Rules have been reviewed and updated to conform to guidelines from the R&A on acceptable Local Rules. These new Local Rules will be posted on the Notice Board adjacent to the card room and on scorecards. All members are urged to read carefully these new Local Rules and understand their effect on play at the MGC.

Many members have heard from various sources of a proposed **optional Local Rule** (to be introduced at the discretion of local club Committees) and perhaps assumed that this will automatically become part of play at the MGC. There has been much discussion on the optional Local Rule which allows players, whose ball may be lost or out of bounds, under penalty of 2 strokes, to drop a ball on the fairway, no nearer the hole than the spot where the ball is "lost" or crossed the out of bounds line. The main purpose of this Local Rule is to enhance speed of play and eliminate the need for players having to take stroke and distance penalty and returning to the place where the previous stroke was played. The R&A have specifically stated that such a local rule should only be used for casual play and would not be permitted for elite amateur or professional events. The MGC Committee having carefully considered the implications of this Local Rule decided **NOT** to introduce this rule for general club play. I fully support this decision. The proposed wording (from the R&A) is lengthy, detailed, confusing and impractical for inclusion on scorecards and Local Rules notice boards. Players already have the option of playing a Provisional Ball if there is the possibility of their ball being lost or going out of bounds - and this approach is highly recommended and to be encouraged!. The use of the Provisional Ball option is a proven time saver and for most play at the MGC, is as effective in speeding up play as would be the proposed optional local rule. Initial feedback from other clubs in this district suggest many will likely not list this as a Local Rule for their course – again it behoves members playing at other courses to read the Local Rules applicable to play at these courses.

Finally in preparation for the new rules, once more I direct members to the R&A site on Modernisation of the Rules of Golf <a href="www.rules.golf">www.rules.golf</a> which is an invaluable resource providing all the information members will need to know on how the new rules will affect their play from January 1, 2019. The early Rules Corners in the 2019 newsletters will also highlight and explain some of these new rules.

## **ALTERNATIVE NEW RULES??!?**

#### NOTICE:

## RULE CHANGES IN EFFECT FOR GOLFERS AGE 65+:

Rule 9.k.34(a): If a tree is between the ball and the hole, and the tree is deemed to be younger than the player, then the ball can be moved without penalty. This is so because this is simply a question of timing; when the player was younger, the tree was not there so the player is being penalized because of his age.



Rule 1.a.5 - A ball sliced or hooked into the Rough shall be lifted and placed on the Fairway at a point equal to the distance it carried or rolled into the Rough with no penalty. The senior player should not be penalized for tall grass which ground keepers failed to mow.

Rule 2.d.6 (B) - A ball hitting a tree shall be deemed NOT to have hit the tree. This is simply bad luck and luck has no place in a scientific game. The senior player must estimate the distance the ball would have travelled if it had not hit the tree, and play the ball from there.

Rule 3.B.3(G) - There shall be no such thing as a lost ball. The missing ball is on or near the course and will eventually be found and pocketed by someone else, thereby making it a stolen ball. The senior player is not to compound the felony by charging himself with a penalty.

Rule 4.c.7(h) - If a putt passes over a hole without dropping, it is deemed to have dropped. The Law of Gravity supersedes the Rules of Golf.

Rule 5. - Putts that stop close enough to the cup that they could be blown in, may be blown in. This does not apply to balls more than three inches from the Hole. No one wants to make a mockery of the game.

Rule 6.a.9(k) - There is no penalty for so-called "out of bounds." If penny-pinching golf course owners bought sufficient land, this would not occur. The senior player deserves an apology, not a penalty.

Rule 7.G.15(z) - There is no penalty for a ball in a water hazard, as golf balls should float. Senior players should not be penalized for any shortcomings of the manufacturers.

Rule 8.k.9(S) - Advertisements claim that golf scores can be improved by purchasing new golf equipment. Since this is financially impractical for many senior players, one-half stroke per hole may be subtracted for using old equipment.

Please advise all your senior friends of these important rule changes and keep multiple copies in your golf bag. Those not following the rules need to be provided a copy.
