Manawatu McDonalds Junior Open: Well done to all who came out for our annual Manawatu McDonalds Junior Open. We had another awesome day and the kids loved the great golf course that we have and also the free McDonalds and Cookie Times which they get for playing in the event.

We had over 70 kids participate this year over the 18, 9, and 6 hole formats. Big thanks to Justin & Kelly Leck (McDonalds Manawatu) and Vicki and Shane (Cookie Time Manawatu) for sponsoring the event. The next event is our Manawatu McDonalds Junior Masters which is normally held in April/May

<u>Tip of the month: Summer golf</u> - The golf course is starting to firm up and winter is in the rear vision mirror finally!! But summer golf brings new challenges with it, not just the positives. So, what can we do to make the most out of summer golf?

1. Try a different ball: The greens are firmer so what can help is a ball with more stopping power. One of the mistakes with golf balls is that we think softer means more spin around the greens, but this is not necessarily the case. A soft ball can sometimes have less spin around the greens. For maximum stop around the greens try a Titleist Pro V1 X, Callaway Chrome soft X LS, or Bridgestone tour B XS.









- 2. Chipping & pitching: The course plays shorter in the summer and because of this we tend to chip more! That shot that was 50m short of the green in winter is now just off the green. Spend time practising the short game and if needed invest in a lesson to help you chip & pitch more successfully.
- 3. Driving: Summer is great for driving but it is also is extremely penalising. As the ground firms up the ball keeps bouncing and rolling and any slight offline drive now rolls under the trees. So, make sure: 1) You have the right driver for you or your driver is set up correctly for your golf game. 2) Here are couple of basics tips to drive the ball better Setup: Ball position inside left heel and tilt away from the target so the left side of the body is slightly higher the right side (for a right-handed golfer, it is the opposite for left-handers). Backswing: Make a full turn, try and get your back pointing at the target at the top of your back swing. A little tip to help you get there is to lift your lead heel up in the backswing which will give you a greater range of motion.
