Eagles History

From the Eagles handbook

After the Auckland Winter Championship in June 1956, 9 men, all top golfers, felt that they should be putting something back into golf. As there was no "Junior Golf", only caddies, the need was evident. Some 20 selected men from various other clubs were asked to attend an informal meeting. It was agreed to round up all youngsters and give them instructions on play, rules and etiquette. Old bags, clubs, balls, etc. were found and given to the needy. The name of "EAGLES" was chosen. Criteria for membership were having represented one's province or having played to a high standard.

By 1958 the group was extended to include administrators who could advise the smaller country clubs on finance, course care, and design while the low markers gave clinics and demonstrations.

A formal meeting was called and with the help of Rugby's "BABAS" constitution the "EAGLES" Golfing Society was formed and after a hearty discussion the Eagle emblem and Red Jacket approved.

The objects of the Society were to "promote golf and good fellowship" always ancillary to the local golf association.

Over the next few years Eagles Golfing Societies were formed and affiliated to the NZ Society. Manawatu Wanganui joined the fold in 1965.

The Eagles Golfing Society and the affiliate district bodies have assisted junior golf on a district and national basis. In the Manawatu Wanganui the support runs to several thousand dollars annually and apart from direct sponsorship to individual district clubs for junior golf, the Manawatu Wanganui District Golf Association is funded for the Eagles Academy which aims to assist developing young golfers on handicaps 5 and over.

Halberg Disability Trust

The Eagles Golfing Society has partnered the Halberg Disability Sports Foundation Trust since 1969. Eagles have contributed through their fundraising golf days in excess of four million dollars to the Halberg Trust. These funds are allocated primarily to the Trust's Activity Fund meeting grants towards equipment and expenses thereby getting children and young people with a physical disability more active more often and linked with sporting and recreational opportunities within their communities. The Manawatu Eagles are planning to hold a "Halberg Day" fundraiser early in the new year.

FEDEX CUP POINTS SUMMARY FOR 2016

For the last couple of years we have used the USPGA tour FEDEX cup points system to rank Saturday men strokeplay results for determining winners of the season long trophies. Each Saturday scores in Division 1 and Division 2 are downloaded from Dotgolf and the top golfer awarded 500 points. Points are allocated down to 70th place (1 point).

The divisions are based on handicap less than 16 (Division 1) and 16 or greater (Division 2). For the last 3 years the average handicap of men playing on Saturday has been consistently around 16.

As we did last year the overall points table combined from all 3 strokeplay competitions (Stroke, Stableford and Par) was published throughout the year and used to select teams for the President versus Club Captain matches. Anthony White was the clear winner this year with 3251 points. The 2015 winner was Pan Charles with 2184 points while in 2014 Rodney Thomas had 2453 points.

On the following page is the table of the top 50 members ranked for each competition.

Generally when you get your card out in the Pro Shop it is automatic entry into the Saturday Club competition. Sometimes entry is optional (when multiple tees are in play i.e. Blue & Black). If you choose not to enter that is your choice.

We get lots of feedback about people taking unacceptable "gimme" putts and thus the impact on these competitions. In the end of the day all we can do is trust that people play honest and fair.

TWILIGHT GOLF

Twilight Golf is back and great value at only \$5 for members, \$10 for affiliates and \$15 for non-members. Tee off between 3.00pm and 5.30pm for 9 holes. You can make up your own group or just turn up and join others. Your proper handicap will be used this year and the Twilight tees are red for men and orange for women.



Simply pop into the Pro Shop when you arrive, print your scorecard through the card machine (just like you would for a normal round of Golf) and pay your entry fee at the Pro Shop counter. Non-members should go directly to the Pro Shop counter to register.

When you go to the touch screen it will ask if you want to enter Twilight. Once you hit 'yes' you will need to select the front 9 or back 9. Please ensure you know which 9 you are going to play before printing your card!

After the round, enter your scorecard as normal into the card room touch screen and leave your scorecard in the cardboard box labelled 'Twilight'. Non members will just leave their card in the box and the organisers will enter it. Results will be done upstairs between 7.45pm and 8.30pm depending on numbers.

A more formal meeting took place on Wednesday November 16. Parents were invited and a large number turned up.




