Tip of the Month: Fast Greens

As we get closer to the PGA the greens will be getting faster and faster. Also when you travel to play at other courses like Cape Kidnappers the greens can be faster than what we are used to. This sometimes can be quite daunting, nerve wracking and frustrating.

Here are some tools to help you combat this. #1: Play for break: When the greens are fast the ball travels slower for a longer period of time which means the putt will break more, so play more break than you think and try to envisage the ball dying into the hole.

#2: Try to match the speed of the ball with the speed of the stroke. When greens are slow swing faster, when greens are fast swing slower!!!!.

Information for Manawatu Golf Club Competitions in 2018

Saturday Men's Stroke play competitions

The Saturday Men's stroke play competition season run from the B&A and Watson Cup Qualifying to the last Saturday in October 2018. The competitions alternate between Stableford, Net and Par rounds and are played in two divisions. See Strokeplay details in the programme book for more information on these competitions. Entry is not always automatic thus you must choose Yes when getting your card if you wish to be entered in the Stroke play comps. By entering strokeplay competitions it is a requirement that you putt out unless playing for zero stableford points or a loss in par competitions. In stroke (net) rounds you must putt out and a pickup should be entered as that when entering your card.

Division 1 is up to course handicap 16 and division 2 handicap 17 or greater. Points are allocated using the USPGA Fedex cup points system. The combined overall points table is published throughout the year.

Feedback sought on having a Men's Foursome round

The Memorial Foursomes Trophy was last played for in 2010 (won by L Innes & N Wynne). While we appreciate that most men appear happy just playing stock standard singles Strokeplay on Saturdays, the Match committee is seeking feedback on playing for this trophy again, perhaps on Closing day for those who do not wish to play the Mixed foursomes competition.

Foursomes definition: Golfers compete in teams of two, using only one ball per team, and taking alternate shots until the hole is completed. Team members take turns in teeing off on each hole, i.e. one player will take the tee shot on odd-numbered holes, and the other on even-numbered holes.

Men's Pennant Competitions

A, B and Handicap grade men's district pennant competitions kick off on Sunday 18th February 2018. If you would like to be considered for selection for any of these teams please contact the respective team managers (A's Ewan Westergaard, B's Ryan Dickins, Handicap Simon Fowler). The districts first Order-of-merit event is being played early this year to allow pennant players a 36 hole hit out before the pennant season starts. The Joe Kealls Memorial is played at Palmerston North Golf Club on Sunday 28th January. Entry via the MWGA website. Entry to this event is not mandatory for pennant team selection but may help!

The Presidents Trophy starts February 25th 2018. Please contact John Clapperton if you would like to be considered for selection.

The Club will be hosted the Men's A pennant round on Sunday 8th April. MCG member's will have reciprocal rights at the other clubs playing in the A pennant round. Bookings should be made in advance via our club's general manager i.e. don't expect to turn up unannounced at another club and expect to receive reciprocal rights.

Information for Manawatu Golf Club Competitions in 2018

Craigs Investment Partners Tankard Club Draw Information

On the first Saturday of every month (February to December) the Men play for a Tankard kindly provided by Craigs Investment Partners. This is a Stableford competition but for afternoon tee slots a club draw is carried out i.e. members are randomly allocated playing partners. To enter go to The Manawatu golf clubs public web page and chose MEMBER ACESSS – EVENT REGISTRATION

Entries close at 5pm the preceding Wednesday and the draw is generally loaded onto the booking system later that evening.

Some notes:

No requests for playing partners will be accepted unless you are playing a designated singles or 4-ball match. Please arrange your matches prior to entering your Club draw booking.

Every attempt will be made to enter designated matches off the 1st tee but otherwise requests for starting off the 1st tee will be ignored.

We will attempt to honour playing time requests i.e. early (11.14 to 11.42), around midday (11.49 to 12.10) or later (after 12.17), but these cannot always be acknowledged. Providing a reason for a specific tee time may assist your request.

We attempt to mix up members teeing off the 1st or 10th tees over the season but please appreciate that this can be difficult to do in a consistent manner.

2018 Men's Shootout

Men playing on Saturdays who wish to enter the season long Shootout qualifying competition can do so by paying the entry fee of \$30 to Warren Williams or Richard Shaw by Friday March 16th 2018. The top 19 golfers entered in the shootout at the end of the season will then play off over 18 holes on Sunday October 28th. In the final the player with the worst net score on each hole is eliminated. Ties are decided by a chip or putt-off.

2018 qualification will be based on the entrant's 8 best Saturday Stableford scores over the season. Please note though that "gimmes" must only be accepted once zero points are available.

Qualifying starts Saturday 27th January and ends on Saturday October 20th. If a tie exists for the 19th position there will be a playoff down the 18th after play on Saturday 27th October 2018.

Every Saturday round (am or pm) will be eligible, except for Saturdays with an away interclub fixture and Opening day. When getting your card you must enter Yes for entry into the Men's Saturday competition for your scores to be included in the shootout table. If you play twice on a Saturday, only the first round will be eligible.

If entry fee is paid before March 16th rounds played between January 27th and March 10th will be used for qualifying. You may enter later in the season but qualifying rounds start from when your entry fee is paid.

Rules Corner

Welcome to the first Rules Corner for the new golfing year. Members are reminded that this year (calendar year 2018) is the last year that the current Rules of Golf will apply – with the proposed changes and new Rules to be introduced January 1, 2019. I am sure there will be much media discussion and comment on the new Rules during this year, and it is my intention to highlight the major proposed changes via this column in our 2018 Newsletters.

I was recently approached by members for a ruling on the following incident:

Players A and B were playing a four ball match against Players C and D. Playing the 9th hole, Player B's second shot ended up on a bare sand covered area adjacent to the bunker in front of the 9th green (see Picture 1) and to further complicate matters, a small branch was immediately behind his ball (see Picture 2). Player B removed the small branch before taking his stance and grounded his club prior to playing his third stroke. Player D (one of his opponents) claimed that Player B's ball was in part of the bunker, and thus Player B was (a) not entitled to remove the loose impediment (2 stroke penalty) and (b) was not entitled to ground his club (a further 2 stroke penalty). Player B rejected Player D's claims. Who is correct?

Rules Corner Answers.

Player B is correct. The definition of a bunker states "A bunker is a hazard consisting of a prepared area of ground, often a hollow from which turf or soil has

been removed and replaced with sand or the like." The key words here are prepared area and in the case described, the sand covered area that Player B's ball was in although contiguous with the bunker – it was not an area specifically prepared to be part of the bunker and was clearly not within the lines of the bunker. Thus it is NOT considered part of the bunker. Similarly, areas adjacent to a bunker that may be covered in loose sand

that has spilled from the bunker (see Picture 3) are not part of the bunker. The bare sand covered area in question in this case is where greens staff access the bunker with the mechanical grooming machine. In spite of repeated efforts, this area has been virtually impossible to keep turfed. It is likely that during the PGA tournament, this and similar areas adjacent to other bunkers on the course will be marked as GUR. In the absence of GUR markings, these areas are to be treated as "through the green" and members will have to play the ball as it lies if their ball ends up in them.

COURSE REPORT

Welcome to 2018. Hope all members and their families had a great holiday period.

In the last couple of months, the weather has been hot and dry with a couple of decent downpours of rain. It would be good if we got little bits over time. The course is in great condition for the time of year and the weather we have had. There are a few wet areas which need addressing over autumn leading in to winter.

Greens have come back with a good dense cover of turf. Fertilizer & wetting agent have been applied. Greens have also been top-dressed after a verticut.

Tees and Surrounds have been fertilised as well as wetting agent applied to keep moisture in the soil profile. Generally, they have a good cover of turf with a few areas burnt off.


Fairways have also been foliar fed and had a wetting agent applied to help with moisture retention. They also are in great condition. As people are aware a few areas have burnt off, they will come back in time.

Rough has greened up after the downpours of rain, we have lifted the height of the mower to help keep grass rather than it turn to dust.

We wish everyone well in the up and coming golfing days. Please continue to repair your pitch marks and repair your divots. Take note of where you are driving your Golf Carts, or where you are walking your trundler and please remember to keep to the paths, especially if you are starting on the 10th. Think of your fellow golfers.

Summary of 2017 Mens Competitions

Saturday Competitions

For the Saturday Strokeplay Competitions (Net, Par & Stableford) we allocate points based on position in Division 1 and 2 using the system used by the USPGA for the Fedex cup. First place gets 500 points, 2nd place 300 points and so on down to 1 point for 70th place. The handicap range for Division 1 is 16 or less and greater than 16 for Division 2. For the last 5 years the average handicap of Saturday fields has been 16 and the division split has resulted in reasonable similar numbers playing in the 2 divisions each week. The following tables show the top 25 for each competition in divisions 1 & 2.

Some (useless) statistics. Over all weeks in the season the average gross score has been 92.3, net 75.8, stableford points 32.3 and par -2.3. These are all 0.4 worse than for last season. Total number of cards entered was 3570 down from 4127 in 2016, most likely reflecting the wet winter we had. On average 102 cards were entered each Saturday compared with 121 last year. It should be noted though that we made entry into the Saturday club competitions optional on most Saturdays this year when it was automatic previously.
