Best Gross Shootout Competition

Similar to the men's shootout this competition captures those members with the lowest 5 gross scores over the club season.

The aims of this competition are:

- To recognise our clubs' best golfers (male & female)
- To encourage low handicap golfers to play Saturdays and MWGA order-of-merit competitions
- · Provide a fun competition for the club's best golfers

Rules of the competition

Eligible cards are those played on Saturdays during the club season, off the club tees e.g. for Men typically Black or Blue tees. The golfer must enter the club competition for the day (not the Proshop competitions).

Scores from MWGA order-of-merit events are eligible for this competition and will be included in the table. As the women's course at Manawatu Golf Club is par 74, women's scores will have 2 shots deducted off them before inclusion in the best gross table.

A member must have at least 5 qualifying rounds.

At the end of the season the Match committee will run a 9-hole shootout with the 10 top qualifiers on Saturday November 16th starting at approximately 2.30pm from the 10th tee. There is an entry fee of \$10.00 which can be payed to the office or Richard Shaw. Entry must be paid by the 28th June 2019. If a member cannot play the designated date & time the next eligible member on the table may enter the shootout.

This shootout will be played off the stick with men playing off the blue tees and women playing off white tees. The person with the highest score on each hole is eliminated. In the event of 2 or more golfers tied on the highest score a chip-off or putt-off will be played with the person furthest from the hole eliminated. Note on hole 10, a par 5 for the women, all women golfers can take 1 shot off their final hole score.

Rules for fences on 11th and 12th Holes

The temporary fences on the 11 &12th are immovable obstructions. You may not cross these fences to get your ball. If you can identify your ball and it is still in bounds you may take free relief (see Rule 16). However, if it is not known or virtually certain that the ball came to rest in or on an abnormal course condition i.e. between the out-of-bounds and the temporary fences and the ball is lost, the player must take stroke-and-distance relief under Rule 18.2. Make sure you have the new rules book in your bag or the App on your phone.

COURSE REPORT

April has been a warm month with temperatures regularly around the 20's. The course is looking a picture, dry with a lot of run. We have been busy on the course with the short weeks. 7th Tee re-construction beginning on the 15th of April, 12th Hole realignment underway. 7th Tee has had around one and a half feet of tee removed, irrigation line and drainage dug in. Once all drainage was in and material in place, we then put around 60m3 of Dune sand on top. Levelling was done, placed the better quality grass from the tee back on as well as some grass off the Range. There is still a little more work to complete.

Greens have plenty of cover, remain consistent throughout. Number 9 green is a bit bobbly due to the Browntup Strike in the core holes being more dominant than the Poa that is there. We plan to top dress when the conditions allow us. Fertiliser will continue as per maintenance program. Solid tining on Monday 6th of May.

Tees have a good cover, are due to be Fertilised. 13th of May they will be Dethatched, over-seeded in thin areas then fertilised. On this day I'm sorry for any inconvenience. It may be possible that a few surrounds are also done depending on time.

Five weeks since being Dethatched the Fairways have come back well. Before winter we will be coring the thin areas (mainly high spots) to throw more seed in.

In the coming month, we hope to get renovations done, 7th Tee playing as well as some weed spraying and other course maintenance. Please continue to repair pitch marks and replace your divots. Now that Winter is coming, please take note of where you are driving your golf carts, also your trundlers.

The Greenkeepers wish Members and Visitors well in their up and coming month of golf. Good luck in your Matches. Anything is possible, look at what Tiger Woods has achieved ©


