The Committee in their budget 2021 preparation have reviewed the club's annual membership fees and it was approved that there will be an increase of 3% on the base subscription (excluding levies) across all membership categories from 1 January 2021. However, the 9 hole category has increased to 53% of the 7 day membership. In making their decision, the Committee took into account the support from the membership during the covid lockdown and this has been followed up by the membership coming out of lockdown and embracing the Club in all areas. The increase will ensure that we can maintain our course and facilities to the standard we have become accustomed to now and in the future. While I'm on the topic of subscriptions, members may wish to consider payment of subs as a monthly Direct Debit, which can be easier to manage than the one payment option. 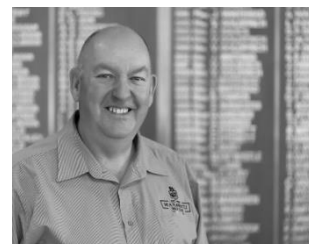

The Committee in their planning for 2021 have committed to some capital expenditure which will be more than beneficial to the Golf Club.

- A new oven has been purchased for the kitchen which will now have double the capacity to what we had in place. This will be installed on 2nd November with the old oven up for sale on Trade Me.
- A range ball dispenser has been ordered and this will give members the opportunity to come down after work and hit range balls. Range tokens and range keys purchased in advance will allow members on the range long after the Pro Shop has closed.
- 6 new lithium golf carts are on their way. These are the world's leading and trusted brand, Club Cars, and purchased on a 0% interest arrangement through one of the Club's major sponsors, Power Turf. These carts will replace the old fleet which are now eight years old.
- The Club has also committed to replace four machines coming off a four year lease. The new greenkeeping equipment will arrive early December and once again these have come at a reduced lease arrangement through Power Turf. One of the course carryall's coming off lease will be purchased at this time.

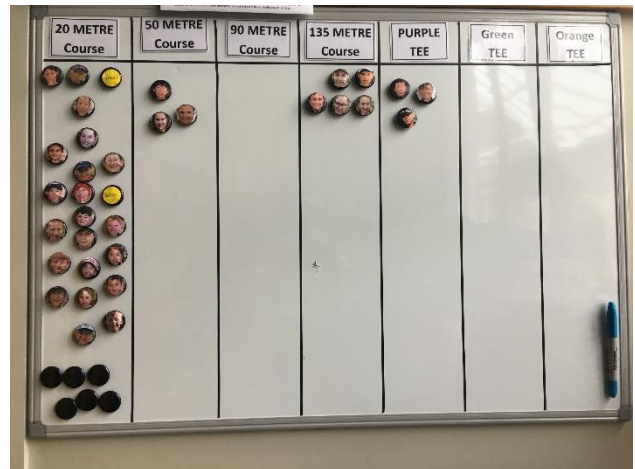
Pro Shop

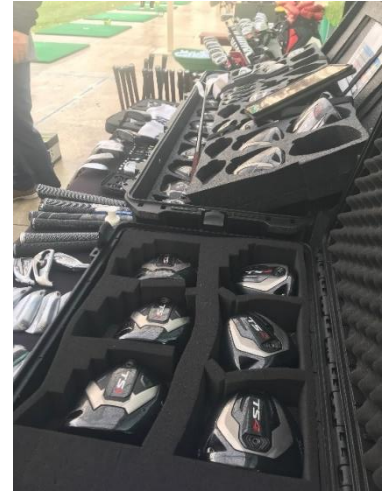
Below are some points to why getting fitted is so important to maximising you driver game:

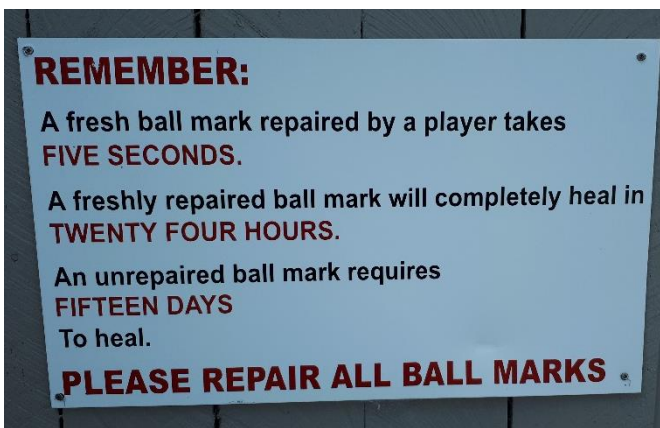

Club Champs Finals 2020 Summary

The 9-holers played their matches amongst the normal 9-hole field in the morning. There were some close matches with both women's finals going to the 9th and 10th holes.

The Men's C-grade & Junior Championship finals were played together and these were close most of the way with the wins by Lyall Schroder and Nick Finlay coming on the 34th hole. Mike Fagan quickly got a solid lead over John Beaumont in the Intermediate final of around 5 up, then the match stayed at a similar margin until the end.

Robyn Higgins won the Bronze 2 final with the last putt on the 18th, while Jack Clarke and Stellan Lawrence took out Junior 18- and 3-hole finals respectively.

As you would expect the Senior women and men matches included some great golf. While Trent Munn got a solid early lead, Regan McConaghty held in there with some clutch putting. Lisa Herbert held a solid lead of 4 up over Casey Chettleburgh after 18 holes, but lost the first 3 holes after lunch. From the 22nd hole onwards the match remained very tight until Lisa stretched away with wins on 33rd, 34th and 35th holes.

The feedback we received on the day was mainly very positive but the Match committee welcomes feedback, especially from this year's competitors before we make a decision on when we will play the finals next year.

2020 Men's Stableford Shootout commentary

The Men's shootout season started promisingly with 65 paid up entries, one of the biggest fields in recent years. However, the invasion of Covid-19 meant that we lost 10 weeks of official play. As a result, the usual 8 qualifying Stableford scores was reduced to 6 for this year.

The top qualifier for 2020 was Euan Avery, 19 under par which was 216 points for the sum of 5 x 36 point rounds).



It looked like there would be a playoff for the 19th spot with 4 tied on 17th place at -6 to par, however the withdrawal of John Beaumont due to a knee injury negated having to do this.

A fine warm day greeted the 19 assembled along with adjudicators Warren Williams and John Bills. The first hole started with the Club Captain having the shortest drive, however a fine 3-wood of just over 220m resulted in a net 4. Bill Barber & Brent Dickins were sweating on net 6s, but Simon Burton who entered the event under an injury cloud exited with an 8 net 7.

On the 2nd hole Ghee Tan had the shortest drive and this proved his undoing, exiting with a 9 net 7. On the 3rd hole Ian Anderson had the shortest drive but improved considerably finishing with 5 net 3. Ezra Burt and Richard Shaw finished with 6 net 5 and entered the first chip off for the day. Richard chipping from the back of the green put his ball flag high but just off the green, however Ezra's chip failed to make the green. On the 4th six entered a putt-off with net 4. Kaleb Idemaru who had the lowest handicap was eliminated when his putt came up short by just 10mm from the next closest putt.

On the 5th Brent Dickins had the shortest drive but Bill Barber exited with 9 net 8. On the 6th four entered a chip off on net 6s. Richard Shaw & Martin Townend chipped about flag high, but Ian Craig and Euan Avery chips only made it half way to the flag, with Euan's the furthest away and thus eliminated. On the 7th Greg Codyre's tee shot went OB but a par with his 2nd ball resulted in a chip off with Peter McRedmond. Both chipped wide left with Greg being too far left.

On the 8th Ian Bevins had a lucky bounce off Bernie's, while Leigh Thomas had bunker and putting trouble to exit with net 6. On the 9th Courier Allan Bailey had the shortest drive, just making the Red tees. This was his undoing exiting with 7 net 6. After lunch, on the 10th a chip off was required between Neil Wynne & Ian Craig with Neil chipping 3-4m short & Ian just past the flag. On the 11th Ian Bevins flirted with the OB again, however he was saved by the Club Captain having a net 6 after hooking his tee shot directly behind the lonesome pine that protects the Green short.

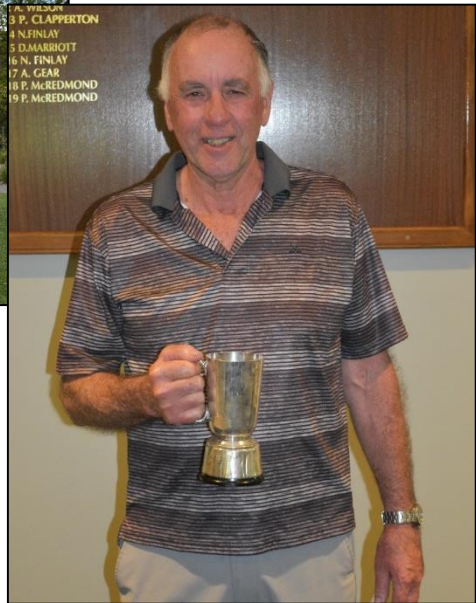
On the 12th only Anthony Dahlkamp tried flying the big tree, producing a great shot to lie just 69m from the flag. Martin Townend had trouble putting from the left rough and eventually conceded the hole.

On the 13th 2 tee shots OB left by Brent Dickins resulted in him conceding and everyone else walking the hole. On the 14th Ian Bevins was shortest off the tee, however this wasn't totally fatal as he entered a putt off with Barry Griffin & Ian Anderson on net 6s. The long uphill putt required careful reading of the break, but for Ian Anderson putting into the left rough was not the correct read. On the 15th, Ian Bevins hit the trees left of the tee block this time and this proved to finally be his downfall exiting with 8 net 7.

Entering the last 3 holes were Peter McRedmond, Ian Craig, Anthony Dahlkamp and Barry Griffin. At the 16th Anthony & Ian had net 2s while Peter & Barry's net 3s meant they had a chip off over the bunker. Both ended up chipping into the bunker landing on the same spot essentially requiring another chip off. Both were not surprisingly long with their 2nd attempts, but Barry was too long, ending well up the bank behind the green. On the 17th Ian & Anthony had to chip out of the right-hand pine trees. Peter was just short of the green for 2 but his chip was way short of the flag. Ian holed a long putt for 5 net 4 and Anthony chipped to 20mm of the hole to make the same score. Peter's first putt was smashed 4m past the hole and he was eliminated with a 3 putt.

On the 18th Ian Craig's drive was very short just making the fairway, but got to the green and flag high for 3. Anthony's drive was good and lay only 115m from the flag, however his 2nd ended up just short right of the green and the following chip lay about 2.5m short of the flag. Ian's 2 putt for 5 net 4, however Anthony also 2 putt for the same score and a chip off was required. Billsey took them to behind the last fairway bunker on 18, dead on 50m from the flag. Anthony chipped first, short right of the green, however Ian's chip was much straighter and longer and won the Shootout for 2020.

Thanks to Warren and John Bills for running the day, Ian Anderson for rulings (I think there was only one) and everyone for the good spirit during the day. Hopefully next year we can go through without the disruptions of this year!

COURSE REPORT

I hope all members and visitors have enjoyed their golf in the past month. As we get closer to summer, the ball bounces further, we all hit the ball a bit longer & enjoy the sun. The course has been enjoying the warmth & drying out nicely.

Just a bit around the surrounds: contrary to the rumours, nothing we did caused the issue currently affecting these areas. This has happened several times before, just not quite to this degree. A combination of moisture & compaction, along with organic matter in the profile created almost perfect conditions for the cover in the high traffic areas to die off. We are coring & under seeding to assist these areas to recover. If you look at the areas that have died, they are where water also sits. It has been on my mind for a while, we are under sowing these areas to get them back in play. In the future we will have barriers to protect these areas. Now with the warmer weather and if the recovery does not work as quick as we would like, we will be turfing the areas.

Overall, the rest of the course is looking great, a lot of growth recently. We are yet to spray the course for weeds. Bunkers are still to get a makeover, drainage holes to be fixed and finished as well as the upkeep of the course, we are getting there. Fairways have great cover as do the Tees. Greens are rolling smooth with a good speed.

Please be aware of where you are walking and driving carts around the course, this also includes the path to the 10th Tee, there are now cart signs out there to follow please. Also please replace your divots and repair your pitch marks, I/we do appreciate your help.

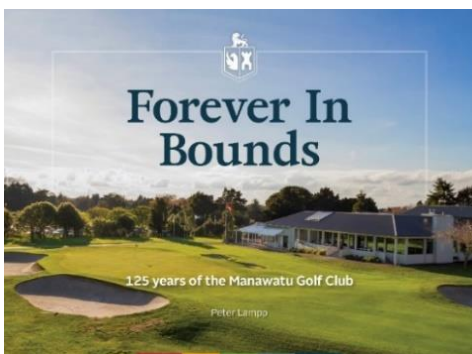
