MESSAGE FROM THE PRESIDENT AND GENERAL MANAGER

The Government has announced this month, the new COVID-19 Protection Framework. This framework brings us a New Zealand where we will be freer to move and live, once the 90% vaccination rate has been achieved. This means less disruptions and offers the Manawatu Golf Club more stability for the business of running the Club.

A key part of this process announced, is the introduction of the Vaccination Certificate for businesses. This would include the Club, which is currently a mix of members, sport, community events, retail, hospitality, functions and events. A recent survey, managed by the Golf Managers Association of New Zealand, asked New Zealand golf clubs their views of the new framework. 88% were in favour of vaccination certificates at golf clubs and 85% were in favour of using vaccination certificates to manage access to the Club.

In principle, the Committee is in favour of implementing the vaccination certificate at Manawatu Golf Club. This will allow us to conduct normal business and operate our Club efficiently and effectively. However, there is still some detail yet to be released by the Government, of how this will be implemented. The Committee is interested in your views, as members. Should the vaccination certificate process be introduced at the Manawatu Golf Club? If not, are you prepared for the Club, to operate under alert level settings, with restrictions in place? We encourage you to share your view with us directly, verbally or in writing. Contact us, or any committee member to share your thoughts on this matter.

The Committee has been working through objectives in the Club Strategic Plan, including our strategic objective 9 – Quality of facilities. As a result, the Committee has resolved to call for registrations of interest from members to join a club infrastructure and assets subcommittee. The sub-committee will analyse the current building, assets, and development programme at the Club, and provide advice to the Committee on priorities, opportunities, and plans. We are particularly interested in people with expertise in property management, construction, planning and asset management.

Also, under our strategic plan, objective 6 – environmental sustainability, the Committee has commenced a piece of work with Green Start and New Zealand Turf Management Solutions to create a robust system for Manawatu Golf Club to expand and improve existing environmental and sustainability impacts. The report will provide us with expert advice of sustainable planting plans, environmentally beneficial approach to soil and turf health and will analyse our water, waste, carbon, and energy use. Initially staff, specifically our course team, will be involved with the consultants, however the scope will include our clubhouse and other amenities.

We have reached the decision to formally halt the Cart Shed project. This was planned to be located next to the Greenkeepers building. After an extensive review, we have concluded that the current plan is not fit for our current needs. We now will take some time, review, and analyse what the usage of the building will be now and in the future. We are very interested in club members feedback on this matter and would welcome your views.

Notice of the Annual General Meeting will be distributed shortly. Hold the date of Monday 31 January, 5.45pm. Notice of meeting, nomination forms for committee and the opportunity to submit notices of motion will be distributed in the first week of December. The club is for its members, so we encourage you to think about what roles you could do.

November is a busy month at the club, with club championships, Gilmour's B-Grade Championship, Tailored NZ Par 3 Challenge and closing day, to name a few. Twilight and summer business house are also underway. Take the opportunity to get to the club and participate in the many events available to you.

Changes to the range of products available in the bar, as previously indicated, are still going to happen. However, COVID-19 has caused a few issues, hence the delay.

We look forward to seeing you at the Club over the next month.






Hi everyone,

Twilight

Twilight is underway for 2021-22. With the Café being very busy from now to Christmas this often makes it impractical to have a Twilight prize-giving, so we have decided to do away with this. The Proshop will now distribute all the prizes. Non-affiliated members now have their own competition on Dotgolf, so no more green cards also.

Pennants

Following this year's inter-club pennant season, Manawatu-Wanganui Golf surveyed pennant players on their preferred options for these competitions going forward. Although there was support amongst many players for change i.e., 18-hole competitions and play on Saturdays rather than Sundays, in the end the status quo remained for most the Men's competitions although the women's format has changed a bit. In 2022 the club will field a Men's A-grade team, B-grade team (36-hole max on Sundays), a D-grade team (18-hole on Sundays), Presidents team, Handicap team (this competition starts after the main pennant season) and a Zones team.

We are seeking members interested in managing/selecting the A, B, & D-grade, Presidents and Handicap teams. Likewise, will we be looking for members interested in playing for our pennant teams in 2022. Members (and you don't have to be a 7-day member) with handicaps approximately 10 and below would be considered for the off-the-stick A, B & D teams. There are 5 rounds and a final and we would expect those putting their names forward to be available for selection for a minimum of 2 rounds and the final. Pennants start Sunday Feb 20th and the finals are on Sunday May 1st. Presidents starts Feb 13th and runs through to June. Handicap pennants starts May 29th.
