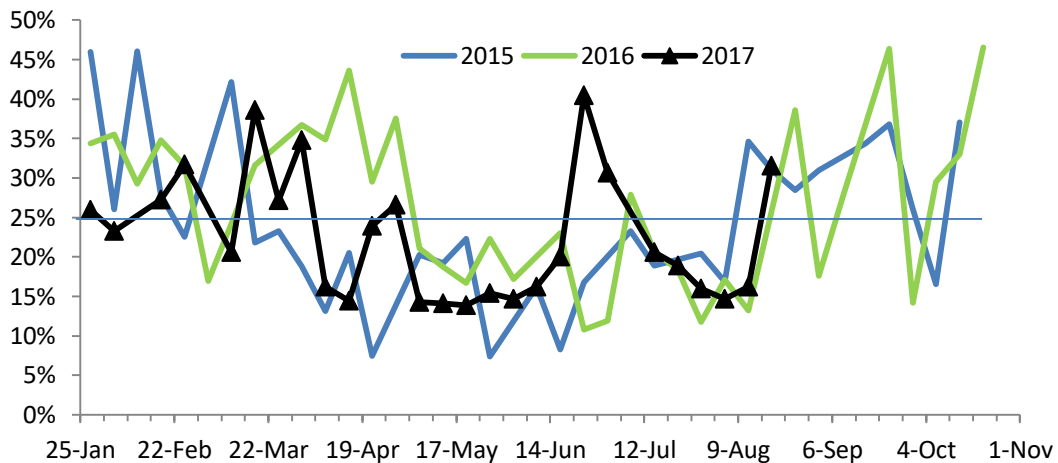


MEN'S GOLF

District Order of merit event results

As much as the rain has affected golf at our club it also has had a big influence on the Manawatu-Wanganui Golf Association's Order-of-merit events played at this time of the year. The Joe Kells Memorial and the women's PN Classic held back in June were played on a very wet Palmerston North Golf Course. The Horowhenua Open was to be played in July but was delayed over a month due to much of the Levin Course being under water. The Wanganui Open was reduced to 18 holes when heavy rain flooded many of their greens.

Thirteen club members did play the Wanganui Open with Mudra Lakhani doing very well to come 3rd in the ladies competition with 79 just three behind back-to-back winner Tara Raj. The best of the men was Guy Perry with 74 who came tied 4th three behind the winner Hayden Ring. Rhys Watkins came 7th with 76. Lachlan Hook came 3rd in division 2 with 83 with Ethan Dodds 4th one shot further back.

The Horowhenua Open was finally played on Sunday 27th August. This too was played over 18 holes as the course was still very wet even after 7 days of sunshine and placing through green was allowed. RULES CORNER

This month I will cover the correct procedure(s) a player is obliged to follow when taking relief from immovable obstructions. I also wish to make some comments relative to the correct procedure when seeking relief from casual water on a putting green.

Immovable Obstructions

In the Definitions section of the Rules of Golf, **obstructions** are defined as **anything artificial**, including the artificial surfaces and sides of roads and paths and manufactured ice **except**:

- a) Objects defining out of bounds such as walls, fences, stakes and railings
- b) Any part of an immovable artificial object that is out of bounds
- c) Any construction declared by the Committee to be an integral part of the course.

If an obstruction cannot be easily moved, it is deemed to be an immovable obstruction. Examples of immovable obstructions on our course include all tee signs, the refuse containers, sprinkler heads, pump house and external piping on hole 3, all formed paths, the roadway across hole 9, the shelter adjacent to the 10th tee, tree stakes, planted trees under 2 club lengths in height (local rule), drinking fountains. Note: stakes defining out of bounds are not immovable (or movable) obstructions and must never be removed by players prior to making a stroke!!

Under Rule 24-2, through the green, a player is only entitled to penalty free relief if the obstruction causes **interference to the player's stance or area of intended swing** – note a player is not entitled to penalty free relief if the obstruction does not interfere with stance or swing but **intervenes** on his/her line of play.

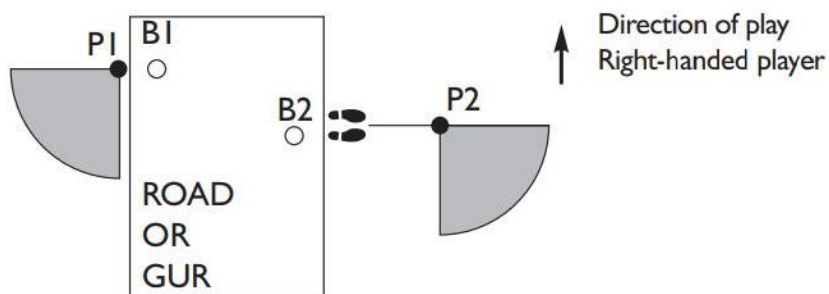
Relief

Through the green, a player may take relief from interference by an immovable obstruction as follows:

The player must **firstly identify the nearest point of relief** – this is the nearest point not nearer the hole where a ball could be placed which provides relief from the interference by the obstruction ie the player can take a stance and with the club intended to be used for the next stroke from this place, the area of the proposed swing is free from interference by the obstruction. **Secondly**, having found this “nearest point of relief” the player is entitled to **drop the ball within 1 club length of this point** (not nearer the hole, avoiding interference by the obstruction, not in a hazard and not on a putting green). The 1 club length arc can be measured with any club. It is important that players study and understand this relief procedure as it applies to other relief situations such as relief from abnormal ground conditions eg, GUR and casual water.

The following diagram illustrates the term “nearest point of relief” in Rules 24-2 (Immovable obstruction) and 25-1 (abnormal ground condition) in the case of a right-handed player. The arrow indicates the direction of play.

RULES CORNER CONT...



B1 = position of ball on road, or in ground under repair (GUR), etc.

P1 = nearest point of relief for ball at B1

P1 shaded area = area within which ball to be dropped, radius of one club-length from P1, measured with any club

B2 = position of ball on road, or in ground under repair (GUR), etc.

Feet = notional stance required to play at P2 with club with which player would expect to play the stroke

P2 = nearest point of relief for ball at B2

P2 shaded area = area within which ball to be dropped, radius of one club-length from P2, measured with any club

Note: The player must find the nearest point of relief – there is no option of selecting the more favourable side of the obstruction or abnormal ground condition. It is possible that the area of free relief may not be very attractive – steep slope, long grass, bushes etc, but if the player opts to take relief, there is no alternative.

When is a player not entitled to free relief from an obstruction?

A player may not take relief under Rule 24 if

- Interference by anything other than the obstruction makes the stroke clearly impracticable or
- Interference by an obstruction would only occur through use of a clearly unreasonable stroke or an unnecessarily abnormal stance, swing or direction of play

Casual water on the putting green

This issue is very topical considering the trying conditions encountered during the first qualifying round for the club championships, especially during the afternoon round. Mid round for most, a very heavy shower (including hail) left most greens with significant surface water. Clearly, many players were unclear as to what relief they were entitled to during the remainder of their round.

What relief is available?

If your ball is on the putting green and there is casual water between your ball and the hole, you are **entitled to move your ball to the nearest point of relief** that is not in a hazard or, if complete relief is not possible, to the **nearest spot equidistant from the hole that provides maximum available relief**. NOTE: The nearest point of relief or maximum available relief may be off the green!!

Note also that there is no relief from casual water on a putting green if your ball is off the green.

During the qualifying round I observed clear evidence that some players had used bunker rakes to squeegee water from their intended line of putt – this a clear breach of Rule 13-2 and players that did this were subject to a 2 stroke penalty on each hole that they used rakes in this manner and potentially subsequent disqualification for returning a false scorecard. While I appreciate how frustrating and difficult the conditions were for all players, those players that infringed should be aware of the potentially serious consequences.
