



MESSAGE FROM THE PRESIDENT

Firstly many of you will be aware that the rezoning for the Centennial Park development was approved by the Commissioners in July, subject to appeal. No appeals were submitted so the rezoning of the land to residential is now complete and the proposed subdivision is likely to proceed. At this point our immediate priority is the signing of a covenant between ourselves and Wallace Developments relating mainly to boundary issues. Once this is agreed upon and signed we can then move forward and consider our options with regard to the holes that will have residential housing close to our boundaries. Any decision relating to possible realignment of any hole that is affected by these issues will be made by the membership of the Club and not the Committee. This would be done via a Special General meeting. Initially the 12th hole will be the first hole affected as Stage 1 of the possible development is along that boundary. The vegetation along the 12th boundary is about to be trimmed and I stress that this is purely a maintenance issue and has nothing to do with boundary issues.

Last week the MacLennan Match Play competition final was held and congratulations to Adrian Christie and Maurice Jackson in taking this out, beating Martyn Nail and Steven Charles. Club champs are now well underway.

This month is a busy month for the Club. This week we host the Boys Under 19 New Zealand Championship and I am sure that there will be some great golf from our up and coming players. At the end of the month we again host the Devil's Own Tournament in its 84th year and this Tournament holds a special place in our club history. We look forward to welcoming all the competitors in both tournaments.

Spring is now here and I congratulate Kiel and his team for the way they've maintained the course throughout winter. The last month or so has been extremely wet, however the course has remained in pristine condition.

It is very pleasing to see the number of visitor rounds played up by 13.1% on same period last year. Member rounds are up 2.2% with a total of 21,000 rounds played and handicapped this year. These numbers don't reflect ambrose or any other special golfing event. The visitor number increase we believe has been caused by the exposure the Club has received from the NZPGA Championship. There are many visitor bookings all the way through to Christmas. Likewise an interesting statistic for the week ending 2 September is that we had 663 guests attending functions here at the clubhouse and this doesn't include café attendees.

Many of you would have noticed the main Honours Board in the clubhouse with information dating back to 1895 has been relocated to the main hallway. Space has run out on the current Honours Board, so the decision has been made to purchase new boards to hang in the clubhouse. Tip of the month: Do you know how far you hit each club?

If you do, well done!!! Knowing how far you hit each club is one of the most important aspects of your game. It still amazes me when I am out coaching golfers that are on 20 handicaps (or even sometimes less than 5 handicap) that don't know how far each club goes and it's not just for the good golfer. Every golfer can benefit from knowing how far they hit the ball with each club no matter their ability. Even if you think you don't hit the ball consistently well enough to bother knowing how far each club goes, it will help you with that as well because it gives you confidence knowing you have the right club and takes away the doubt that often leads to bad shots.

If you need assistance getting this info we can help!!! We professionally work out your distances using our flight scope - all you need to do is book in a 30min time with us that costs \$49.00 and we will get your distances for you. Then we will either print or email you the data so you know how far each club goes and you can choose the right club for each distance from driver to sand wedge.

We were lucky enough to have Laurel and Hardy join us on tour with a bit of entertainment, also a lovely dinner out.



Rules Corner

The time has come for us to start seriously considering the proposed new Rules of Golf which will come in to effect January 1, 2019. There is currently considerable behind the scenes activity involving the R&A, USGA, NZ Golf, District Associations and local golf referees in preparing for these new rules. NZ Golf has already sent very helpful material to clubs, local golf associations and referees with further materials about to be distributed in September. A series of NZ Golf run workshops on the new rules is scheduled for October which will provide an opportunity for local golf referees and others interested to be trained up to provide courses locally on the new rules. A series of local courses on the new rules (classroom presentations and practical demonstrations) is planned for November and December which we hope will be well supported. Meanwhile, the current Rules of Golf apply to play through the rest of 2018.

The R&A have produced an excellent site <u>www.rules.golf</u> entitled "Rules Modernisation: A Fundamental Revision to the Rules of Golf for 2019" which provides comprehensive information on the proposed new rules. I highly recommend members view this site. The site covers the following material:

- 1. Introduction to the Rules of Golf for 2019 a series of short videos highlighting the main changes to the Rules
- 2. The Background to the changes in the new rules including a historical perspective, the timing of the changes, what the combined Rules committee set out to achieve and when they will be implemented
- 3. Major Rule Changes for 2019
- 4. A link to a Resource Library this link provides detailed information on the new rules including a full on line version of the new rules. The revised approach to the writing and presentation of the new rules, and a sample of the new Rule Book style.

I am confident this site will become the reference location for golfers of all abilities that are interested in preparing themselves for the new rules that start in 2019. Please do make yourselves familiar with this site. The clever use of short videos covering many of the new rules will assist members with their understanding of the 2019 Rules of Golf.

Greens are great with good dense cover. They have been solid tined, top dressed and fertilised. Please keep repairing your pitch marks, it has been great to see.

Tees have all been cored, we have yet to dethatch Par 3s and get a top dressing on. 6 or 7 surrounds have been cored so we have still got last few to complete.

Fairways have great cover on them, have been fertilised and sliced. There are areas that are wet and boggy, we are working through them. The wet spots change every year so it is a chasing game, to try and fix the moving problem.

Green keepers wish all members well in their up and coming matches and we hope visitors enjoy the great facilities. We all look forward to the warmer temperatures in the coming months. Enjoy your month whatever it may bring.

Please keep replacing your divots, repairing your pitch marks. Be aware of where you walk, drive your carts and trundlers.
